

STATE INDUSTRIAL OWNERSHIP FOUGHT

Campaign Issue in North Dakota Framed by Anti-Nonpartisans

MOVE TO RECALL GOVERNOR

 Deed's Lake, N. D., April 1.—Petitions calling for a recall for election against three state officials elected by Nonpartisan League endorsement will be circulated soon. It was announced today following the decision last night of the anti-Nonpartisan convention here in ordering such action. The election will be held on or before November 8, 1921.

In addition to seeking the recall of Governor Frank J. Frazier, William Lantz, attorney general, and J. N. Hagan, commissioner of agriculture and labor, the three members comprising the state industrial commission, to the voters at the same time a series of constitutional amendments which would change the state-owned industrial program.

Principal among these would be liquidation of the Bank of North Dakota and abandonment of the state-owned industries with the exception of the Grand Forks mill and elevator. A bond issue of \$5,000,000 to retire outstanding bonds and pay all liabilities of the Bank of North Dakota is provided for. Another bond issue of \$2,000,000 would be used to clear up the affairs of the State Mill and Elevator Association and also provide for the completion of the mill at Grand Forks, while a third issue of \$250,000 would retire debts of the Home Builders' Association.

It also is proposed to limit the bonded indebtedness of the state to \$7,750,000. R. A. Nestos of Minot, Republic, was the choice of the anti-Nonpartisans for governor. Reports from Bismarck were that the Nonpartisan League legislative committee will institute a counter-recall against independent state officials.
