

GRUNDY TO FIGHT SPROUL TAX PLAN

Battle Expected When Administration Revenue Program Comes Up This Week

SEE OLD FEUD RENEWED

Harrisburg, April 3. The real fight to the finish between Joseph R. Grundy, president of the Pennsylvania Manufacturers' Association, and Governor Sproul, over the vital question of new taxes for many purposes, will in all probability be staged this week. In fact, it is proposed to make the State Administration's program of revenue raising a special order of business in the House for tomorrow.

This date, however, may be changed. Not much doubt can be expected, however, for the reason that the Legislature is now on its last day. Only four more short legislative weeks, including the present, remain in which to do business.

Ever since the Legislature opened it has been expected by the public that something along the line of the Legislature would be needed for extensions over revenue, and that the House would re-organize through the entire Republican State Administration.

Grundy's case today is a desperate one. He has a point where it will break out with renewed vigor and result in a sharp clash over whether or not this is the time to impose new taxes.

TO FOUND SCHOLARSHIP

High School for Girls to Plan Memorial to Dr. Fred Gowling

The pupils and faculty of the Philadelphia High School for Girls are founding a scholarship for college education as a memorial to Dr. Fred Gowling, who at the time of his death, was principal of the school.

Plans for the scholarship were announced last Friday. Miss Mary A. Bock, assistant principal of the school, said yesterday that the plan under consideration is for a scholarship of about \$200 annually. To insure this \$10,000 is needed.

Grundy men claim credit for having killed the Sterling bill, which would have replaced the present Board of Education in Philadelphia with an elective board. They do not say they started this fight to kill the bill in the House when it had been planned to kill it in the Senate. But they do claim that when Senator Penrose telephoned Grundy last Tuesday night to kill the measure, they were the real marshals who went out and made sure of the necessary votes to back the Governor's bill.

Male Test of Strength

In that sense, Grundy says, there has been a test of strength between them and Administration leaders who wanted the Senate to have the credit of killing the bill. Of course, Grundy leaders say the Sterling bill provided no basis of the discussion publicly proclaimed by Grundy.

Legislators say that if the Grundy men are to kill any of the revenue bills, they will have to do it in the House. Hence the battle is imminent.

Compensation Salaries in House

Harrisburg, April 3. Senator Vane's bill increasing salaries of members of the Legislature, Compensation Board, of which H. H. A. Mendenhall is chairman, which passed the upper chamber with ease, is apparently to slip inevitably through the House. This bill is now for second reading tonight. The salary of the chairman would be increased from \$7,000 to \$8,000 and of the other members from \$7,000 to \$8,500.
