Policies Not Completed

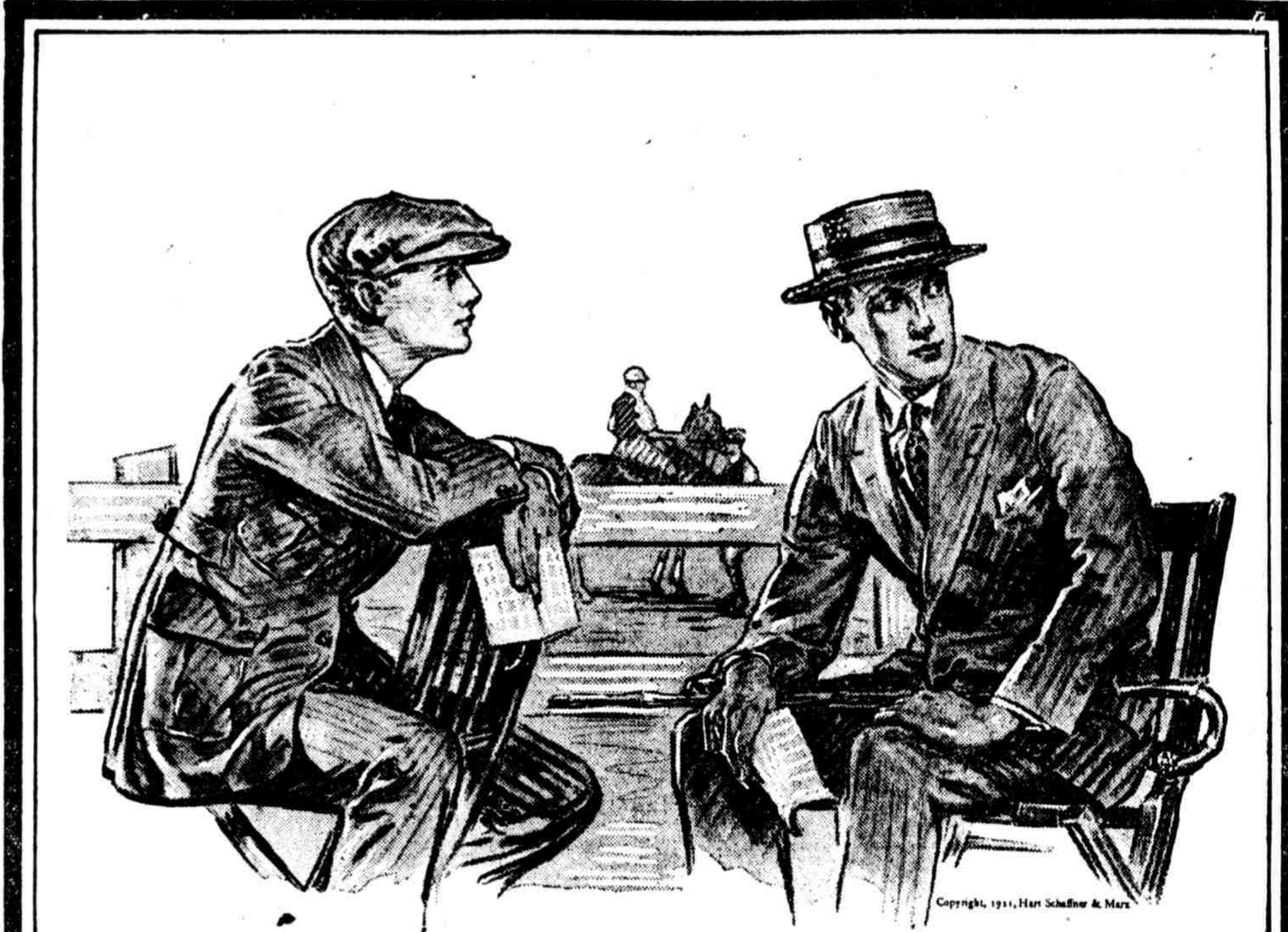
