

SAYS BOOTLEGGERS MADE \$60,000,000

Prosecutor Charges Cincinnati Man With Controlling Nation-Wide Ring

TWO FINED \$3000 APIECE

Buffalo, N. Y., April 13.—Charges that a nation-wide bootleggers' ring is in existence and that it is dominated by a Cincinnati man who has made \$60,000,000 since the prohibition amendment went into effect, were made yesterday in Federal District Court by John F. Walsh, assistant district attorney, when he spoke in connection with the sentencing of Superior John P. (Doc) Mackey and John J. Gannon, convicted of conspiring to transport liquor unlawfully.

Mr. Walsh said he had sufficient evidence had been disclosed to indict the Cincinnati man, and the information had been sent to Cincinnati. Mackey and Gannon pleaded guilty to seven counts against them and were fined \$2000 each. They were charged with bringing into the district several carloads of whisky worth about \$150,000.

New York, April 13.—Police officials and magistrates yesterday had a grave discussion over the question of whether a man's hip pocket is, under the law, a "vehicle" when he is carrying a flask in it.

SON EXONERATES FATHER

Furman G. Cole Says He Alone Was Responsible for \$20,000 Theft

Wilmington, Del., April 13.—Furman G. Cole, secretary-treasurer of Deeds of New Castle County, who is serving a life-term sentence in the workhouse for conspiracy to defraud more than \$20,000 from the office, swore on the stand before Judge Conrad and Bayne and a jury in the Superior Court yesterday that the theft of public moneys from the Board of Public Works was his own doing.

Cole declared that his father, William G. Cole, former Board member, and Walter Hallock and Hiram Dennis, former clerks in the office, who were on trial on a charge of conspiracy in connection with the embezzlement, had absolutely nothing to do with the defalcations.

The case will probably go to the jury tomorrow. It has been on trial for a week.
