

HIGHWAYWOMAN CONFESSES GUILT

Marjorie Harris Admits Aiding
Victor Hollis in Taking
Taxicab From Driver

MAN FORMER TEACHER

Marjorie Harris, of this city, pleaded
guilty in the Criminal Court at Norris-

town today to the charge of aiding Victor Hollis in holding up and robbing a taxicab driver near Willow Grove several weeks ago. Judge Miller will sentence them Saturday.

The woman, who is twenty-three years old and separated from her husband, admitted she and Hollis hired Joseph Pagan to take them to Hathers, and at a lonely spot near Willow Grove Hollis covered the driver with a revolver while she bound his hands.

She said they took him to the side of the road and were tying him to a tree, but finally gave him fifty cents and told him to walk to Willow Grove.

They proceeded in the cab to Reading and Harrisburg. Returning they stopped at Bernville, where the suspicions of the hotel man resulted in their arrest. Hollis, it developed in court, formerly

was an instructor in a Philadelphia college. He is twenty-seven years old and a graduate electrical engineer, and was for a time in charge of electrical construction for a railroad at Bluefield, Va.

According to their story, he married a Philadelphia girl named Anna Donnelly, who was separated and returned to Toronto. There he met Marjorie Harris, who came to live with him here.

According to Hollis, he was made idle by business depression and resorted to robbery as a means of obtaining money with which to buy food and clothes.
