

HOOVER WILL END PEACE FORUM TALK

Secretary of Commerce to Make Closing Address of Series at Academy Tonight

TO BE GUEST OF ENGINEERS

Herbert Hoover, Secretary of Commerce, will arrive in Philadelphia today to speak on "The Peace Question and the Armistice," the last of the addresses of the Peace Forum at the Academy of Music for tonight.

He will remain in the city tomorrow to be the central figure at a national gathering of engineers when the executive board of the American Engineering Council of the Federated American Engineering Societies meets.

Secretary Hoover's address tonight will be the first delivered since he accepted the portfolio of commerce. The public will be privileged to occupy all seats not taken by the regular ticket holders in the Peace Conference Series at 8:30 o'clock. Five minutes will be granted for the appearance of seats and the talk will begin at 8:55 o'clock.

Following the business sessions of the engineering executive board tomorrow, Mr. Hoover will be tendered a dinner at the Bellevue-Stratford by the Engineers' Club of Philadelphia. He will be given a certificate of honorary membership in the club and will deliver the principal address, in which, it is expected, he will touch upon national politics.

The presiding officer of the dinner will be G. Aertsen, president of the club, and the toastmaster will be Major Joseph A. Steinmetz, past president of the club. Other speakers will include Dean Dexter S. Kimball, of Cornell University; J. C. Trautwine, Jr., and George Wharton Pepper. More than 600 leading engineers from New York, Philadelphia and other cities will attend.

SONS OF OHIO DINE

Held Seventeenth Annual Dinner in Honor of the Rev. Dr. J. W. Hoffman

The seventeenth annual dinner of the Ohio Society of Philadelphia last night was given in honor of the Rev. Dr. John W. Hoffman, president of the Ohio Wesleyan University. It took place in the Hotel Adelphia.

Doctor Hoffman, the principal speaker, stressed the necessity for higher tax on tobacco in the country's schools and higher instructions of learning, which he characterized as the greater hope of the nation in uprooting radicalism.

"There was a shortage of 10,000 teachers in the country last year," Doctor Hoffman said. "That is an unhealthy condition."

The Rev. W. L. Evers, president of the organization, and the Rev. Fr. Frank P. Parker were other speakers.
