Northwestern Trust Player Leads Basketball League Individual Scorers

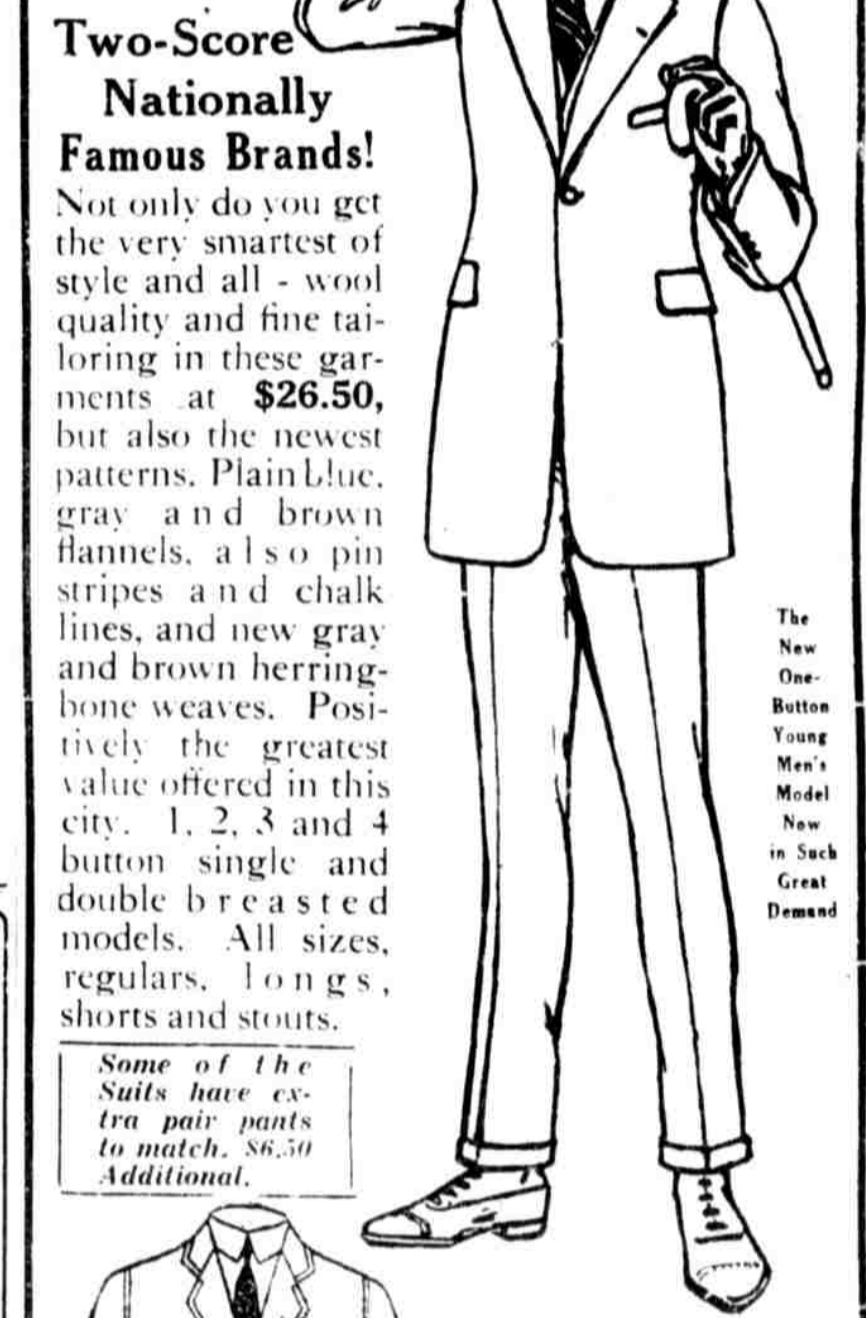
