Harding Pins Congressional Decoration on Gunner Who Saved Ship

Washington, April 15. - Robert Edward Cox. of Belmont, Pa., a chief gunser in the navy, yesterday enjoyed the

ger in the navy, yesterday enjoyed the distinction of having the President of the United States personally pin on his breast the highest award for valor—the Congressional Medat of Honor.

The ecremony took place in the East Room of the White House, on the seventeenth anniversary of the day on which Cox saved the battleship Missouri from destruction by flooding her aftermagazines after an explosion in a turget had set fire to powder in the ad-

teining handling room.

Thirty men were killed in the

Cox at that time held the rank of garrant officer and was debarred from peciving the medal of honor by the law providing for its award only to calisted men, though the recommenda-tion of the captain of the Missouri was approved by the commander-in-chief of the North Atlantic Fleet and President Roosevelt. Not until last February was special legislation enacted permitting exception to be made in Cox's case. In presenting the medal President
