Pennsylvania Police Searching West Virginia Coal Fields for Fugitive
Pittsburgh, Pa., April 20. (By A. P.)—Police officials announced today that two Pittsburgh detectives assigned by state troopers of West Virginia, are scouring the Mason creek region near Williamson, W. Va., for Jim Thomas, Negro, who is wanted in connection with the killing of a white woman.
Detectives Earl M. Donald and Edward O'Rourke of the Pittsburgh force, were detailed to investigate reports that Thomas was in the Mason creek region, authorities said. They were accompanied by a Negro who furnished the information upon which the investigation was started.
Thomas, who was being held in connection with the death of Mrs. Anna Kinker, escaped from a hospital here.

ANDREWS SHIELDED BY HIS WIFE NO. 1

She Refuses to Testify Against Him in New Jersey Court
FACES CONNECTICUT TRIAL
New York, April 20. (By A. P.)—Mrs. Andrews, the much-married stock broker, is expected to attend herself today to James J. Walsh, prosecuting attorney of Greenwich, Conn., to stand trial on charges of bigamy and perjury preferred against him as a result of his movements recently have been followed in so much mystery it could not be ascertained whether he had left the city.
Mrs. Andrews yesterday visited the offices of Slade & Slade, lawyers, and a member of the firm said they had been retained to represent the broker in Connecticut, and that Benjamin Slade, Connecticut representative of the firm, would handle the case.
The reported decision of Mr. Andrews to surrender himself to the Connecticut authorities followed closely the announcement by Jacob J. Lazarus, his New York lawyer, that he would not be surrendered today, and the appearance of Mrs. Anna Andrews, wife No. 1, before the Hudson county grand jury in Jersey City.
Mrs. Andrews was subpoenaed last Friday to appear before the grand jury to tell what she knew of the alleged relations between her husband and Mrs. Esther Tatum Andrews, wife No. 2, with whom the first wife lived under the same roof for more than three months. She did not appear up to 4 o'clock in the afternoon, when the result that James T. Clark, assistant prosecutor, sent word she would have to appear within ten minutes or he would send a policeman after her. Mrs. Andrews entered the grand jury room well within the time limit.

DIVORCES MISSING MAN
Wife Says He Dropped Out of Sight Twelve Years Ago
On the ground of desertion, Mrs. Annie Grove, of Broadway and Atlantic avenue, Camden, was yesterday granted a divorce from Winfield Scott Grove. Mrs. Grove claimed that her husband dropped out of sight and nothing was heard from him since one morning in September, 1909. She had been married twenty years.
By the recommendation of Judge Ralph W. E. Donges, who heard testimony of a special master in chancery, Joseph Meshke, a trolley conductor, has been granted a divorce in Camden upon statutory grounds.
Declaring that her husband would strike her in the eye and then say he was sorry the blow did not destroy her sight, Mrs. William Diehl, of 447 Stevens street, Camden, was granted a divorce from John W. Diehl yesterday. The couple were married in December, 1907, and lived together until July 31, 1907, when the wife alleges she was compelled to leave on account of extreme cruelty.
Seeking support for herself and child, Mrs. Arthur Cohen, of No. 1010 Line street, Camden, told Judge Kates yesterday that her husband beat her and he said he "only beat her when he had to." It was said he was jealous. Cohen was ordered to pay \$10 a week, having said he received \$45 a week as a writer, with tips averaging \$25 a week. He was committed in default of a bond.

IS D'ALERIA DELIRIOUS?
County's Sanity Will Be Tested in Los Angeles Tomorrow
Los Angeles, April 20. (By A. P.)—Count Armand d'Aleria, of Spain, young husband of the widow of former United States Senator George Nixon, of Nevada, is in the psychiatric ward of the county prison awaiting a hearing tomorrow on a charge of insanity.
He was arrested after his mother, Countess Marguerite d'Aleria, of Pasadena, had sworn to a complaint alleging her son had threatened to kill both her and himself. The countess charged the threats had been made at her residence, where her son called in company with Esther Kitch, a motion-picture actress. The countess caused the arrest of the prince on a charge of disturbing the peace. The latter was released under bond.
The count was arrested in the apartments of his wife.

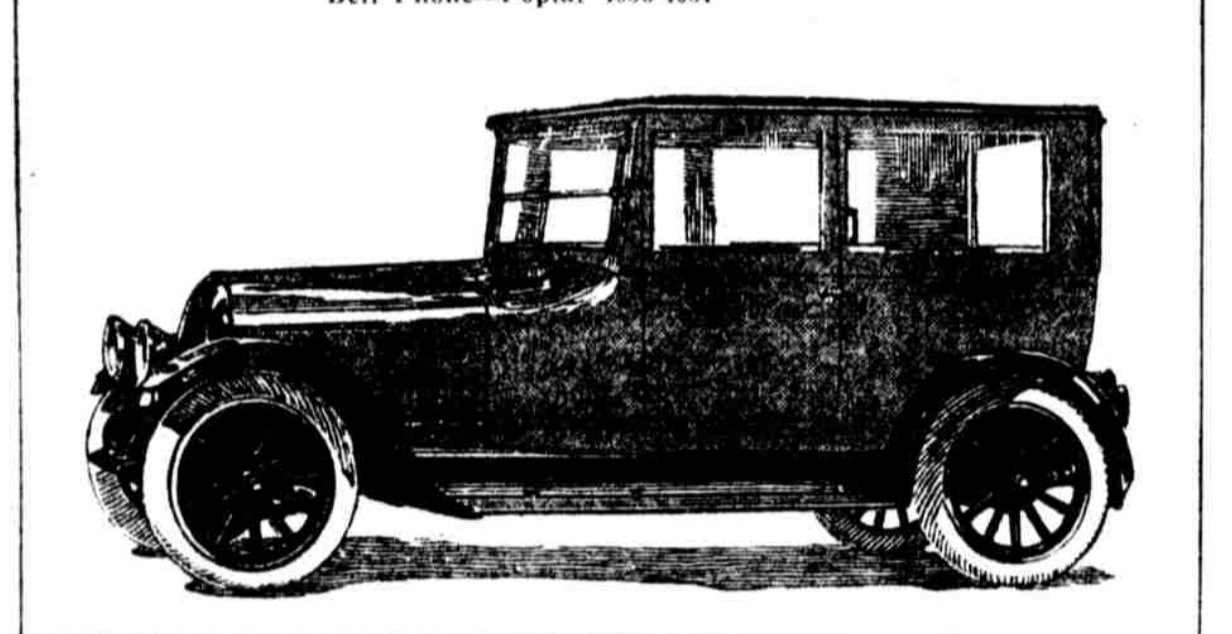

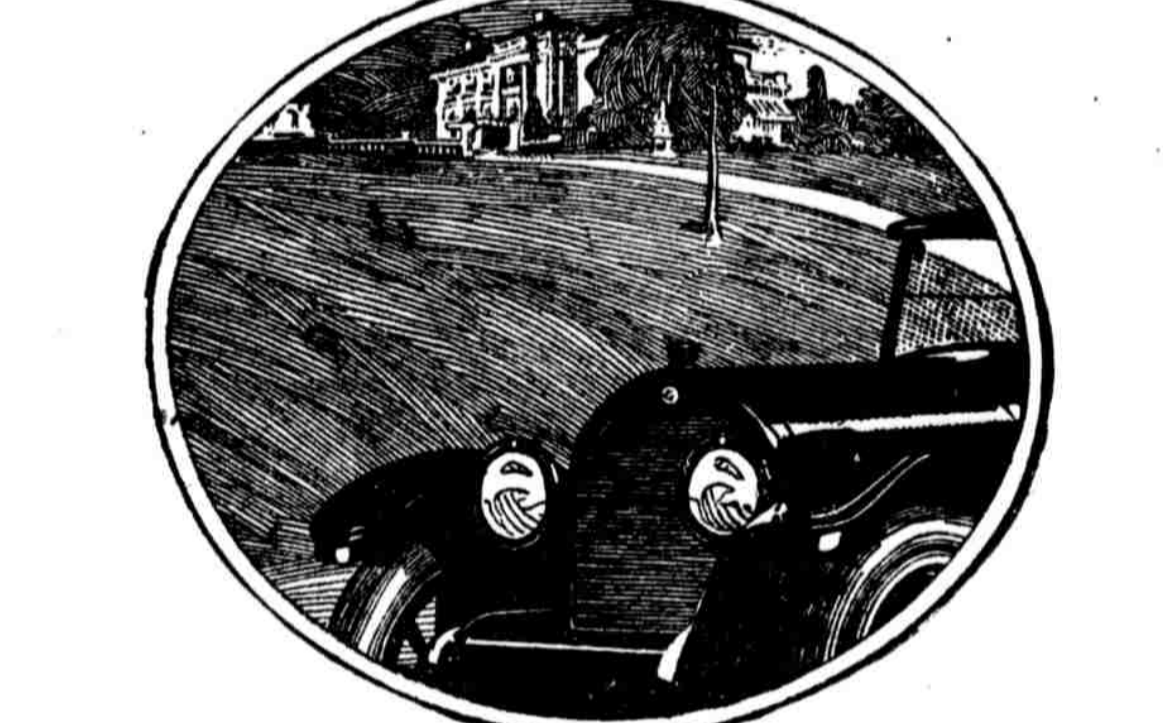
