

LEGION POSTS PLAN HONORS TO HEROES

Memorial Day Exercises Will Be Held Both at Home and Abroad

TO DECORATE THE GRAVES

Legion posts throughout the state and the country are completing preparations for the proper commemoration and decoration of the graves of the war dead, both here and overseas, on Memorial Day.

A great many of the war dead have been brought here and buried by their relatives and friends in the city.

many of whose names are perpetuated in the Legion posts named for them, will receive special attention. A number of the men for whom Philadelphia posts are named are buried here and the posts have appointed special committees to visit their graves as a mark of respect May 30 and place wreaths and memorials. Attention to other graves of war dead in the same cemetery will not be overlooked by these committees.

The care of the majority of the dead in the great American cemeteries in France will be amply taken care of by the government and patriotic societies in France that are pledged to look out for the graves of the foreign soldiers who died in helping her achieve her salvation.

In addition many of the Legion posts in this country have made independent arrangements for the decoration of the graves of their comrades who are yet in French soil. Among these is the William T. Szelatine Post, of Philadelphia. Commander W. L. Jenkins has completed arrangements to provide special decoration for the graves of his comrades in France. Relatives of these men living in the Thirty-ninth ward who wish to take advantage of the arrangements should get in touch with Commander Jenkins.

David W. Jameson Post, No. 183, will make a pilgrimage to Toms River on Memorial Day to the grave of David W. Jameson, for whom the post is named, to devote his grave with suitable ceremony. Memorial Day plans are in charge of the post chaplain, William S. Delp, 1002 Wallace street.

Members of the Prince-Förbes Post will devote the graves of Lieutenant Harry W. Prince and Lieutenant Oliver D. Förbes, for whom the post is named. Both were in the aviation service. Lieutenant Förbes was killed in a flight accident in England and Lieutenant Förbes died following an operation at Brooks Field, Tex.

Many of the post's members will wear poppies as a memorial to the dead in France as they march in the Memorial Day parade.
