

### NEW AMBLER PLEA TO QUASH CHARGES

Former Insurance Chief's Counsel to Attack North Penn Embezzlement Indictments

#### ARGUMENT IN CHAMBERS

A motion to quash the indictments against Charles A. Ambler, former state insurance commissioner, who is to go on trial next Tuesday, was argued today before Judge Henry, in chambers, at City Hall. Ambler was arrested after the collapse of the North Penn Bank in 1919.

Michael J. Ryan and Samuel F. Herman, attorneys for Ambler, argued for nearly an hour on five points in support of a motion to quash the indictments.

Assistant District Attorney Taulane, opposing, said Ambler's counsel "lacked legal sufficiency" in their reasoning and covered virtually the same ground covered in arguments before Judge Martin recently, who dismissed a motion to quash.

Judge Henry reserved decision. Representatives of the district attorney's office characterized Ambler's move as "an eleventh-hour attempt to block the trial next Tuesday."
