NEW AMBLER PLEA TO QUASH CHARGES

Former Insurance Chief's Counsel to Attack North Penn Embezzlement Indictments

ARGUMENT IN CHAMBERS

A motion to quash the indictments against Charles A. Ambler, former state insurance commissioner, who is to go on trial next Tuesday, was argued today before Judge Henry, in chambers. at City Hall. Ambler was arrested after the collapse of the North Penn Bank in 1919.

Michael J. Ryan and Samuel F. Herman, attorneys for Ambler, argued for nearly an hour on five points in support of a motion to quash the indictments.

Assistant District Attorney Taulane, opposing, said Ambier's counsel "lacked legal sufficiency" in their reasoning and covered virtually the same ground covered in arguments before Judge Martin recently, who dismissed a motion to quash

Judge Henry reserved decision. Representatives of the district attorney's office characterized Ambier's move as "an eleventh-hour attempt to block the

trial next Tuesday."

There are three indictments against the former insurance commissioner. One charges embezzlement as receiver, agent and attorney of funds of the Pittsburgh Life and Trust Co.; another charges embezzlement as agent and attorney of the same corporation; the third, unlaw-ful conversion of funds as insurance commissioner.

Criminal action was begun ugainst Ambler when the bank probe disclosed that funds held by him as receiver for the Pittsburgh company had been de-posited in the North Penn Bank.




