

### LEGION CONVENTION URGED HERE IN 1926

Local Post Starts Action to Bring National Meeting to Philadelphia

### IN SESQUICENTENNIAL YEAR

A Legion movement to bring the national American Legion convention here in the summer of 1926, to coincide with the projected sesquicentennial exposition, is under way.

The project had its beginning last night at the first annual dinner of the Franklin Post, No. 405, at Kugler's banquet rooms. The post unanimously adopted a resolution at the dinner, directing its representatives in the county committee to present to that committee at its next meeting Tuesday evening a resolution requesting that body to authorize the appointment of a special committee to carry through such a program. Maylin J. Pickering, chairman of the post delegation, will present the resolution to the county committee.

The suggestion for the convention to coincide with the exposition was made by George Wentworth Carr, former county chairman, to the Franklin Post

Abbott, past post commander, was toastmaster. The speakers included Thomas Moore, district deputy commander for Philadelphia; H. G. C. Williams, vice commander; H. B. Ellison, assistant finance officer, and Dr. Herman Trager, chairman of the post home committee. The dinner arrangements were in charge of Franklin G. Connor.

Frederick D. and Irving S. Clair Post, No. 37, has announced a campaign for funds to acquire a memorial clubhouse for the post. A number of subscriptions have already been received.

The Overseas Club of the Shubin-Buchbaum Post, No. 95, met last night at the home of Post Commander Martin G. Stein, 1041 South Broad street. A number of overseas men were guests of members of the post at the meeting.

Members of the Frederick M. Rodgers Post, Palmyra, N. J., have voted unanimously to turn over a percentage of the state bonus money, which will be paid to them, to the fund for the erection of a Legion memorial building. More than 300 applications for the bonus have been filed through this post.

### MRS. MOORE'S JURY FEES TO AID OLD PENSIONERS

Aged Couple Kept From Separation by Bounty of Mayor's Wife—Will Get \$45 She Earned

An aged married couple—"my old folks," as Mrs. J. Hampton Moore calls them—are to enjoy such comforts as the \$45 earned by the Mayor's wife in three weeks' service on a jury, will help them materially. The old man has been selling knives and other little things from door to door for a meager living.

"He isn't lazy, but he is feeble. He wondered if he could do something for the Mayor or the city, but he isn't really able."


"Well, I was so disgusted when I found how little organized charity was doing for them that I decided to take full responsibility myself. There are no in-between persons who must be paid out of my offering. When I take them \$10 they get it all. Naturally those who work with these organizations must be paid, but \$10 dwindles to about \$2 when it reaches the needy by that route. At the time I found these people they were receiving from an organization their rent and \$1 a month for provisions."

"It really helps a lot to see such cases. I'm so interested that I go each week, or oftener when I can, to take food and other necessities. I put gas into the house for them, because I was afraid they would have a fire with the old-fashioned oil lamps. It's worth while doing anything for them because they are so grateful."

"I first heard of them, or rather saw them, about a year ago. It was shortly after the Mayor took his office and I was making a tour of inspection with the housing committee."

"They are both past the allotted three score and ten and the little old woman is almost blind. I was attracted to them at once and started an investigation on my own account. I found that their greatest fear was separation and the organized charity that had been giving them scant assistance was about to put them in different institutions."

"You know that would have been cruel," said Mrs. Moore, and her eyes filled. "They have no relatives and few friends; none who had the wherewithal

# A Transportation Crisis

There is a grave and immediate danger and injustice threatened to every motor truck owner in Pennsylvania, to every farmer, to every man whose business requires Transportation, to every individual householder and housewife.

The Pennsylvania State Legislature proposes immediately to pass an Act (Woodward Bill No. 367), which will increase motor truck license fees from 80% to 200%, in accordance with the following schedule:
