

ELOPERS FORGIVEN; TO FINISH STUDIES

Former Pupil in Overbrook School Must Give Up Husband Three Years

PARENTS DICTATE TERMS

New York, April 25.—Forgiveness and the parental blessing were bestowed yesterday on a pretty Kate Stevens, eight-year-old heiress to the estimated \$15,000,000 estate of her father, Calvin Amory Stevens, the Broad street re- cluse, and Richard Fagan, nineteen-year-old Dartmouth student, with whom she eloped.

The winsome, vivacious and handsome young husband, whom she married ten days ago, arrived from Boston to "face the music."

But instead of the parental wrath they had secretly feared, they were promptly forgiven at a little family reunion at the Belmont Hotel.

William R. Fagan, stock exchange broker, the bridegroom's father, and Mrs. Jessie I. Stevens, widow of the eccentric multi-millionaire, met the elopers, by arrangement, in the reception room of the hotel yesterday afternoon.

Young Dick, the broad-shouldered, athletic student, and met his mother-in-law before—once before the last marriage and twice since. But the older Fagan had never seen his daughter-in-law until Dick formally introduced them yesterday with a clumsy: "Well, Dad, here's my bride—Kate."

The staid, dignified broker's features broke into a smile as he held the beautiful girl. The next moment he had her in his arms, kissing her tenderly as a father would his daughter.

Introductions over, the two parents and the young couple adjourned to a secluded nook in the main dining room where the belated wedding feast was served.

Incidentally, Dick's father and Kate's mother, in the presence of the elopers, talked over the future plans for the couple.

It was decided that Dick, who resigned from Dartmouth following his wedding, should resume his studies in the fall.

At the same time Kate will enter some finishing school, and when they have both completed their course they will settle down in a little home of their own.

RIVER VICTIM'S BODY FOUND

Detroit Police Unable to Explain How Janissee Met Death

Detroit, April 25.—(By A. P.)—County authorities recovered the body of Arthur Janissee from the Detroit river yesterday. They had been search- ing since last Thursday, when Janissee was reported to have been killed and thrown from a launch in which he was bringing four Toledo men here from Windsor, Ontario.

The four men are in custody of the police, who declared two of them have confessed to slaying Janissee. Authori- ties were unable to say what caused death, there being no marks of violence except a bruise on the head.

ARREST MURDER SUSPECT

Son of Man Killed in Florida Taken Into Custody in New Jersey New York, April 24.—(By A. P.)—Arrested in Somerville, N. J., in con- nection with the murder of his father in Orlando, Fla., John R. Bryant to- day was reported to have declared he did not know his father was dead. Bryant was taken in custody with his wife and infant child after they had been found in destitute circumstances and given shelter on a farm near New Brunswick.

The body of the father was found buried in a lonely spot near Orlando several weeks ago. A pet dog was buried at his side.

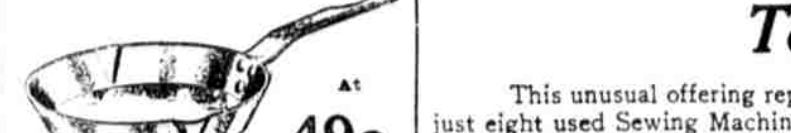
