

ONE KILLED, 9 HURT IN STREET MISHAPS

Unidentified Man Victim of Trolley Car at Thirty-eighth and Spruce Streets

AUTO FRACTURES A SKULL

One man was killed and nine other persons were injured in trolley and automobile accidents in the city yesterday.

The man killed has not been identified. He was struck by a trolley car which was turning the corner of Thirty-eighth and Spruce streets last night.
