

PRESBYTERY OPENS PAGEANT TONIGHT

Presbyterians to Visualize Work of Church Here and in Foreign Lands

TO CONTINUE THREE DAYS

The Presbyterian Exposition of the Philadelphia Presbytery will open at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon in St. Paul's Presbyterian Church, Fifth street and Baltimore avenue, with a women's pageant program, addresses and motion pictures.

Afternoon and evening sessions of the exposition will continue today, tomorrow and Thursday with such features as: A Trip Around the World, a concert of Christian Liberty and special motion pictures.

The exposition will be educational, including the Presbyterian's contribution to the work of their Church throughout the world. Churches of the city will organize delegations to attend.

Following the women's pageant at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon, the women will be taken on a tour of the world and shown mission demonstrations, exhibits of work lands, and will be given opportunities to hear costume lectures.

There will be a general exhibit from 7 to 8 o'clock this evening followed by the Pageant of Christian Liberty, "The Striking of America's Hour," at 8:45. From 9:45 to 10:15 visitors will be shown a general exhibit.

A special session for children will be held from 4 o'clock until 5:30 tomorrow afternoon, with five other sessions for adults. A similar program will be carried out Thursday.

In the exhibits of the nations the North American Indian will be represented by the Calvary Church, Mexicans by the Fourth Church, Mountainers, Patterson Memorial Church, Alaska, West Hope Church, Freedman, First African Church, Latin America, Rehearsal Memorial Church, China, Nestor Memorial Church, Africa, St. Paul's Church, India, Bethany Temple, Japan, Nineteenth Street.

MILDRED FAAS RECITAL
Soprano Gives Entertaining Evening of Song in Witherspoon Hall

Miss Mildred Faas, well known far beyond the limits of Philadelphia as a fine singer, especially of sacred music, gave a recital in Witherspoon Hall last evening before an audience which was not so large as the merits of the concert warranted, but which was thoroughly appreciative of the work of the soloist.

Miss Faas was in fairly good voice, although she has been heard to better advantage at other appearances in this city. Her program was almost entirely lyric, as that is her forte, together with fine vocalization and a uniform if not highly colored tone quality. The program was a varied one and called for highly diversified styles of singing. The first group was composed of songs by Lully, Morley, Purcell and Bach, and in the difficult singing of the last named Miss Faas is a specialist.

The second was a group of German lieder by Schubert and Schumann and was made up of four of the finest songs of these two greatest of song composers. The third was a group of Russian and French songs and the last group was sung in English. Miss Faas was heartily applauded at the end of each of the four sections which made up the program and received a number of floral congratulations from her friends. Conrad von Bos played the difficult accompaniments in his usual artistic and restrained manner.

FOOD SURVEY POSTPONED
Proposal to Raise \$10,000 for Work Called Off for Present

Pending financing of their proposed food survey for Philadelphia and vicinity, the special committee of women representing the committee of twenty-one has postponed notice of its approval of the plan. A meeting at the Bureau of Municipal Research, scheduled for today, has been called off.

Miss Mary Ingham, member of the committee, declared the necessary financing, approximating a working fund of \$10,000, will be forthcoming a little later, but that all hopes of the city's making the survey has disappeared. "This is understandable, as

the question is one bigger than any municipality," she said.

Dr. Clyde King, of the University of Pennsylvania, is named as the man the committee would like to put in charge of the survey. "We hope we can get it under way this summer," said Miss Ingham, "as this is the most favorable time to get the facts we need."
