



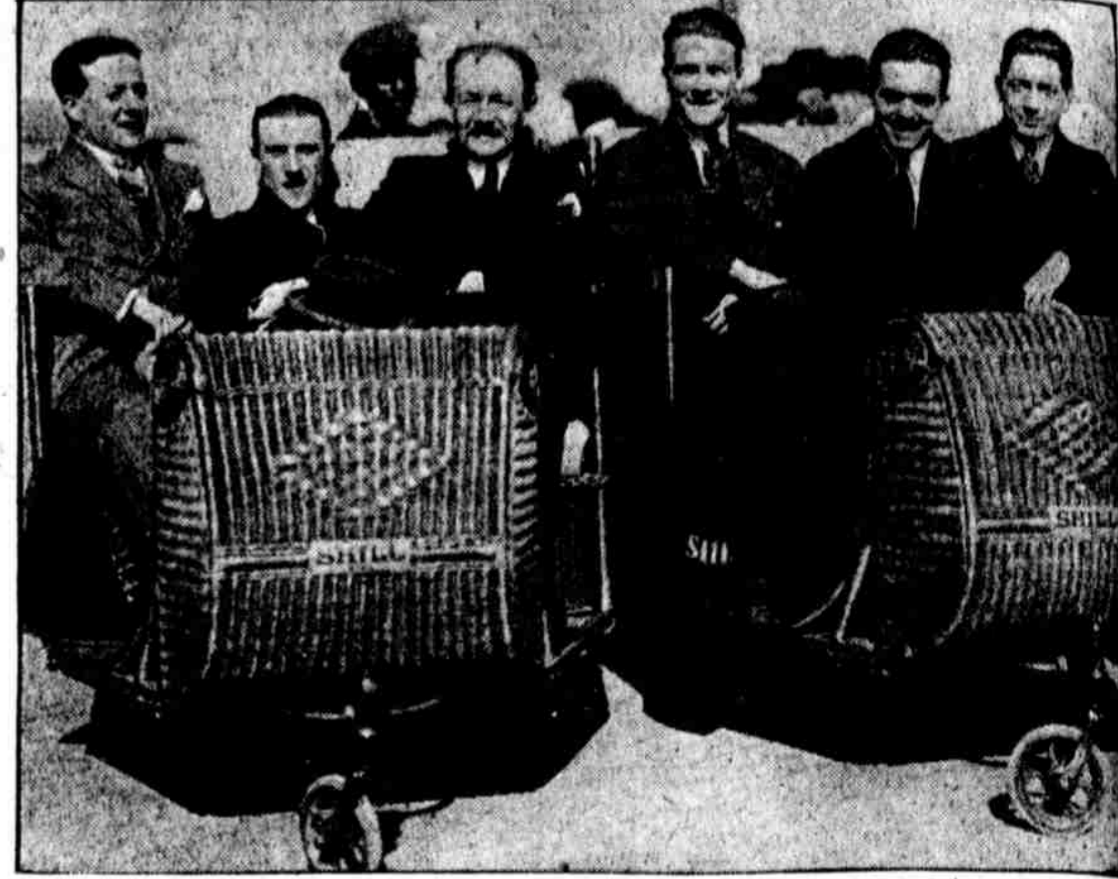

GETTING READY. The British Provincial polo team practicing at Tidworth. Colonel Tomkinson (left) is one of the stars of the team.



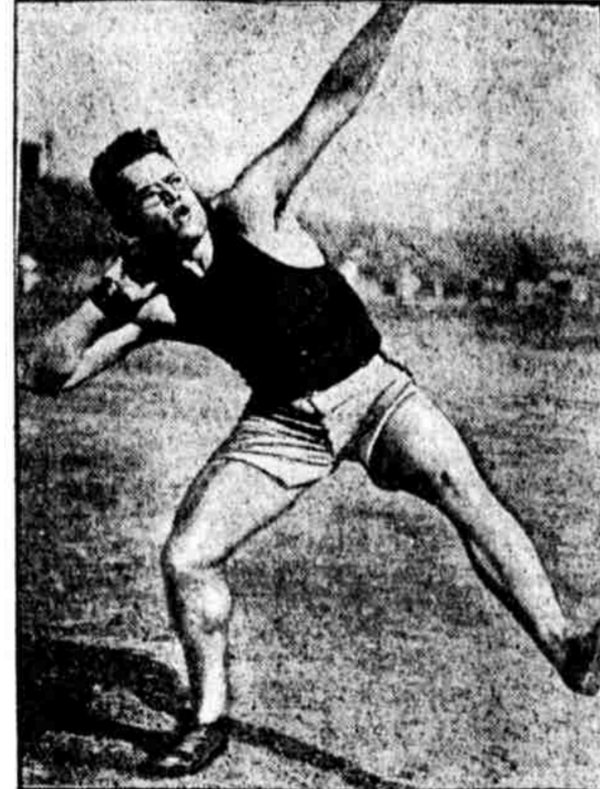

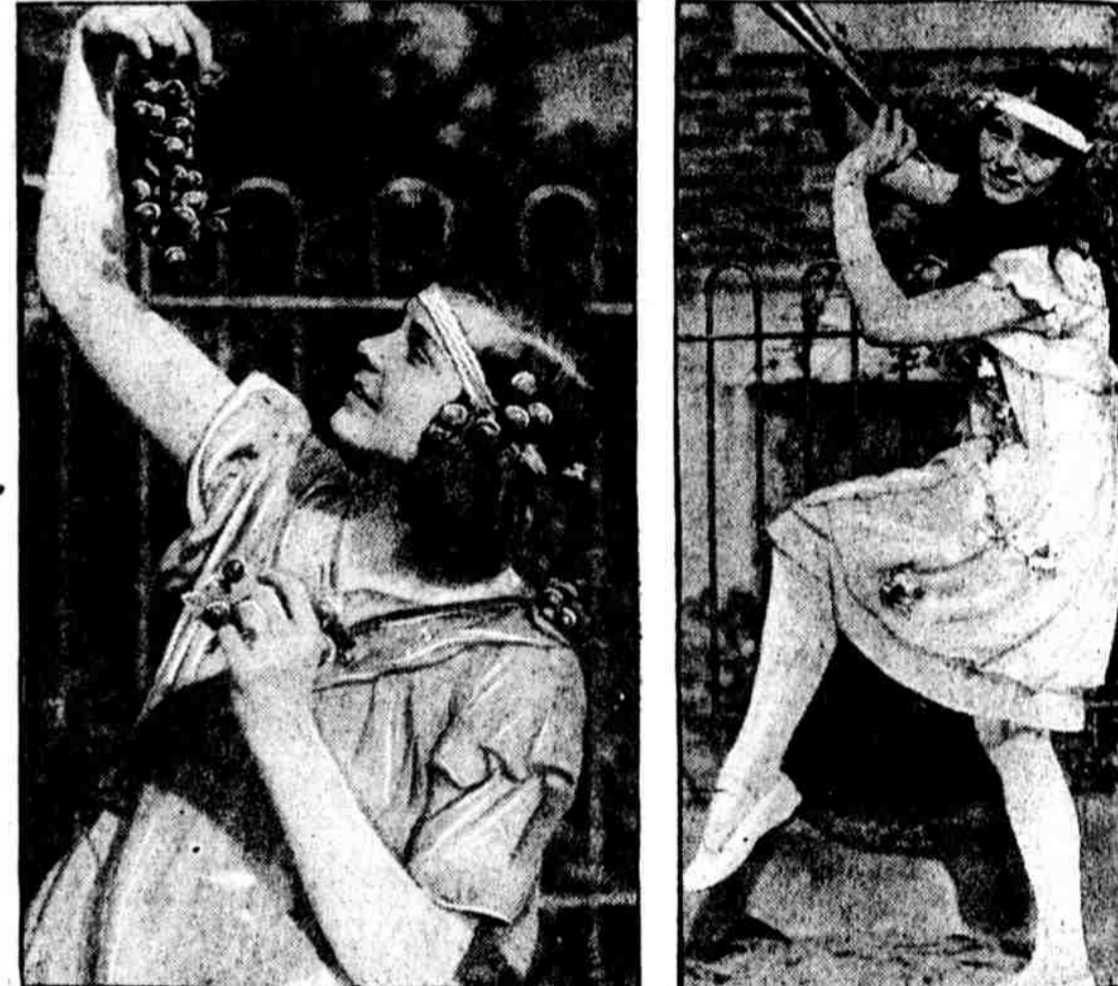
