

GIVEN BIG BOOST

Week's Events Presented Convincing Testimony of Progress on Constructive Side

New York, April 30.—The outstanding feature of today's brief session in the stock market was the renewed pool activities in the motor stocks and motor accessories, especially the shares of the two companies. Prices in these two groups were marked up from one to over five points with the most flagrant manipulation witnessed for considerable long time.

Movement of the general list was marked by the same conflicting irregularity manifested in the preceding session. Another crack was made at the all-steel advance opening, with the steel market showing a decided recovery. Overwhelming strength and buoyancy of the motor shares and their accessories quickly turned the tide and before the end of the first hour the market began to climb. Excepting the equipment and some pool specialists, the market did not make much headway, although there was a striking advance in the all-steel and steel shares had been under pressure at the opening.

The overreaction of the pools displayed through the rapid capture in prices of the steel market, which in the first half hour of the trading, which, in turn, cut down a considerable part of the earlier improvement.

The market's developments developments supplied the same curious mixture of good and bad. Despite this conflicting surface influence, it was quite evident, even to an inexperienced layman, that the market was reaching a juncture wherein the line of least resistance was encountered in the forward swings.

This would hardly warrant the implication of a major forward movement, having started. It does suggest the market, fundamentally, is getting in good shape. The usual preliminary skirmish of the day is being fought, but in many quarters of the list, but such window dressing is common experience in the approaching turn or at the beginning of the tide of market values.

It is still a market under the complete domination of the professional element in consequence of the continuedebb of constructive interest, with the power of the constructive side apparently in ascendancy as the week's developments quite plainly demonstrated.
