

CONVICTS TO HELP BUILD NEW HOME

500 Will Leave Eastern Penitentiary to Aid on Rockview Prison

Twenty-five heavily guarded convicts will leave the grim old Eastern Penitentiary tomorrow morning and journey to the new penitentiary at Rockview, Center county. The arrivals will aid in completing their new home. Warden McKenty is picking out short-termers who have good records, and eventually more than 500 men will be transferred, easing overcrowded conditions at the prison here. There are about 1000 men now in the Eastern Penitentiary.

More will be sent as soon as arrangements can be made to transport and receive them, and eventually it is planned to abolish both the Eastern Penitentiary here and Riverdale, the old penitentiary at Pittsburgh, and concentrate all the prisoners at Rockview.

These transfers are being made under provisions of the Stewart bill. This act has removed all legal obstacles to the concentration of the state's convicts at Rockview, and the consequent abandonment of the old prison.

Excavations at the new penitentiary will take place in one of the most modern buildings for the purpose in the country. It is situated on a plateau in the 1900-acre tract, within the prison boundaries, and is constructed of reinforced concrete. The building contains eight cells, an autopsy room, corridors, office, execution chamber and a large mechanical department.

RUBBING IT IN

Man, Thrown Through Window, Arrested for Breaking the Glass

Victor Gibson, twenty-eight years old and no home, met the sad fate of being thrown through a plate-glass window late last night and then being arrested for breaking the glass. Gibson and another man whose legs were as agile as his arms were strong, engaged in a fight in front of a restaurant at 2228 Market street. Gibson's adversary picked him up bodily and chucked him into the restaurant, via the main window, then ran away before the police came.

Patrolman Deegan, of the Fifteenth and Vine streets station, dug Gibson out of the debris and then arrested him for malicious mischief. Beyond a few scratches he was unhurt.
