

# CHINA GOVERNMENT MAY BE RECOGNIZED

### British Military Mission Arrives at Capital of Far Eastern Siberian Republic

SOVIET UPHELD IN COURT

Riga, May 12. The arrival of a British military mission at Chita, capital of the Far Eastern Republic of Siberia, is reported in a Moscow dispatch to the Letvian telegraph agency, which adds that recognition of the Chita Government by the Powers is imminent.  
In connection with the Far Eastern situation, a Royal dispatch reports that the Prince of Orléans is organizing new forces in Siberia, his son General Scudamore and three other officers being in the field.

London, May 12. By A. P. The initial judicial decision rendered in a Royal dispatch to have resigned because of differences with Premier Lénine over the question of freedom of trade in Petrograd. Among the resignations are said to be those of M. Zinovieff, the Military Governor and Sergius Zorin.

### STEFANSSON TO GO NORTH

Veteran Explorer Will Investigate Arctic in Two or Three Years  
Pasadena, Calif., May 12. By A. P. Another expedition into the Arctic regions in two or three years is planned by a veteran professional explorer, he announced here today at the residence of Ernest De Koven Lofing, also an explorer, where he is a guest.  
Despite the discovery of the North Pole, Stefansson said, there remains much room for exploration in the Arctic.  
"The center of the unbound regions of the North Pole has been reached by man," he said. "The North Pole region is but miles from the edge of the ice area, while the center is 500 miles from the edge. We are venturing our interest on getting to the center and finding out what is there. I have no theories. It may be land or ice."

### DUCHESS WINS FREEDOM

Marlborough Divorce Made Absolute by British Court After 6 Months  
London, May 12. By A. P. The divorce granted last November to the Duchess of Marlborough, formerly Countess of Salisbury, which she sought for some time, has been made absolute by the British court.  
Under the provisions of the British law, six months must intervene between the granting of a divorce decree and the making of a judgment making the divorce absolute.  
At the trial of this case last November, allegations of adultery and immorality were made by the husband against the duchess.
