## WANTS AMERICAN MARKS RECOGNIZED

### A. A. U. Secretary Sails for International Federation Gathering in Switzerland

### KIRBY LEAVES TOMORROW

New York, May 13.—Frederick W. Rubien, secretary of the Amateur Athletic Union, was on the steamer Mauretania today en route to Europe to attend a series of meetings of the International Amateur Athletic Federation, which will be held in Switzerland this month and in June.

Gustavus T. Kirby, president of the American Olympic Committee, will attend tomorrow and will join Rubien on the other side.

The most important part of Rubien's mission is to lay before the federation the claims for recognition of world records on track, field and in swimming made by American athletes since the last meetings of the federation at Lyons, France, in 1915.

Rubien said records made by athletes here since last November will not be submitted, as they have not yet been accepted by the Amateur Athletic Union.

A proposition will be placed before the federation by Rubien, suggesting the adoption of more uniform rules for amateur athletics throughout the world and for the establishment of a fifth Olympic program.
