

MME. CURIE TO TELL COUNCIL OF RADIUM

French Scientist, Discoverer of Metal, Accepts Invitation to Speak Here

WILL BE GUEST OF CITY

Madame Marie Curie, discoverer of radium, one of the most marvelous and mysterious substances known to man, will accept an invitation to address the Council here the day that body appropriates \$250,000 for the purchase of two grams of the element.

Assurance to this effect was given today in New York City where the famous French savant is a guest. Members of her party said Madame Curie would be pleased to accept the invitation voted yesterday by members of Council.

Purchase of the radium was approved by Council's Finance Committee after that course had been urged by Director of Health Eubank and

other prominent physicians who told of its amazing curative powers in the treatment of cancer.

The two grams of radium, insignificant in size but containing almost incredible energy, will be used at the Philadelphia General Hospital in the treatment of malignant cancer.

Special Plant Planned

The hospital will be supplied with an emanation plant so the emanations of the radium may be utilized. Hundreds of cancer patients will receive partial relief now from opiates but will have their pain relieved by the radium rays, it is said, and the cause gradually removed.

Madame Curie left New York City today on a lecture tour and will speak at Bryn Mawr College, probably next week. Her first visit out of New York will be to Northampton, Mass., where she will be the guest of Smith College.

To Be Guest at Vassar

She will remain at Smith over night and tomorrow will go by automobile to Vassar, stopping on the way at Mount Holyoke College, where she will receive the greetings of the students. She will not leave the automobile. She expects to reach Vassar tomorrow afternoon and will remain over Sunday, arriving here Monday morning.

Monday she will be the guest of the American Chemical Society and other chemists' associations at the Waldorf.

Reception at Museum

A reception will be held for her on Monday evening at the American Museum of Natural History. On Tuesday she will go to Washington, D. C., to receive the gram of radium, which is to be presented by President Harding.

Tug and Barges Aground

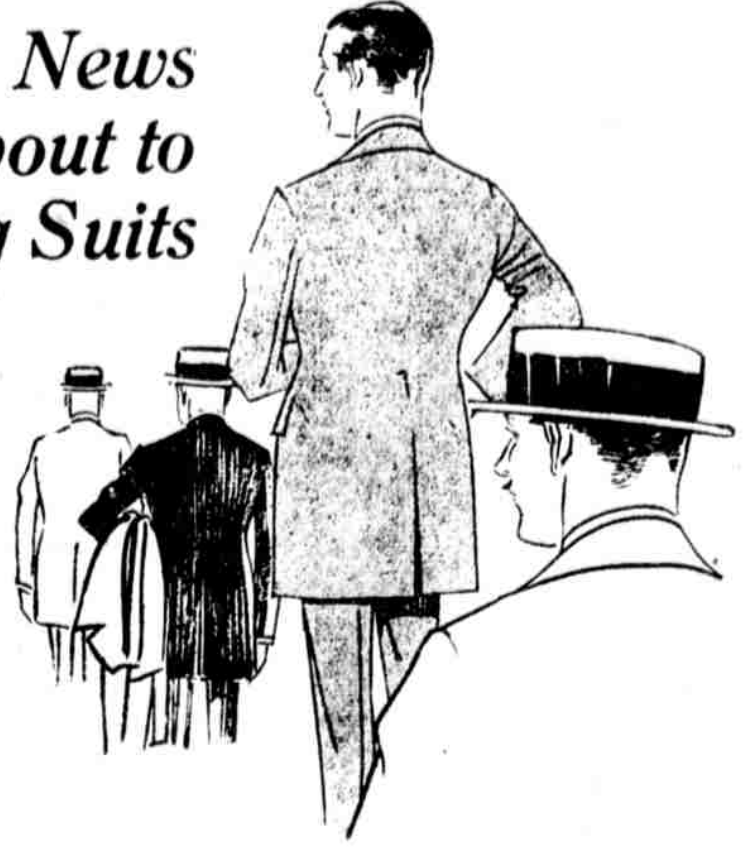

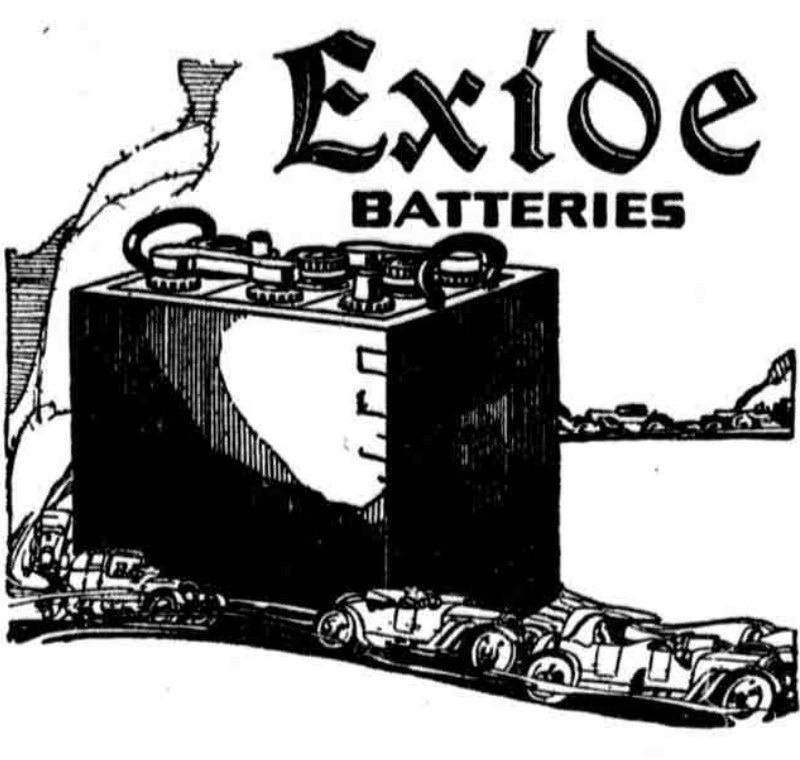
