

DIVORCE IS ASKED BY GEORGE BIDDLE

War Romance Ended, Lieutenant Sues Daughter of B. Dawson Coleman

Mrs. Anne Coleman Biddle, who did emergency aid work in the devastated regions of France during the war, has been named as defendant in a suit for divorce filed by George Biddle, a former army lieutenant.

The marriage was the outcome of a pretty war-time romance and was celebrated August 3, 1917, at the home of the bride's father, B. Dawson Coleman, then living at 1830 Rittenhouse square.

Mrs. Biddle, now said to be living in Paris, has been called upon to file an answer to the suit in Common Pleas Court No. 5 on or before June 5.

Mrs. Biddle made an enviable record back of the front-line trenches when the Germans were still hurling divisions against the Allied lines. Much of her first-aid work was among the peasants
