J. MILLER'S HITTING IS WEEK'S FEATURE

Philly First-Sacker Clouting at 333 Clip—Donovan Has Ten Men Hitting .300, While Athletics Have Only Three Such Performers

The batting of Jack Miller has been one of the big features of the National League during the last week. According to the figures given out by the veteran first sacker of the Phillies the clouting at the rate of .333. He still is led by Ralph Miller, whose figure is .364. The other members of the Phillies who are hitting .300 or better are Meadows, Weibert, Betts, Parkinson, Wrightstone, Brugg, Meusel and Le Bonvau.

Cy Williams has come up considerably in his hitting. His figure is now .286, a figure that should see them much higher than they are in the league standing. Horner still clings to the leadership in the parent league, having swatted this far at the rate of .457. There are twenty batters in the National League who have played in twenty games or more who are hitting .300 or higher.
