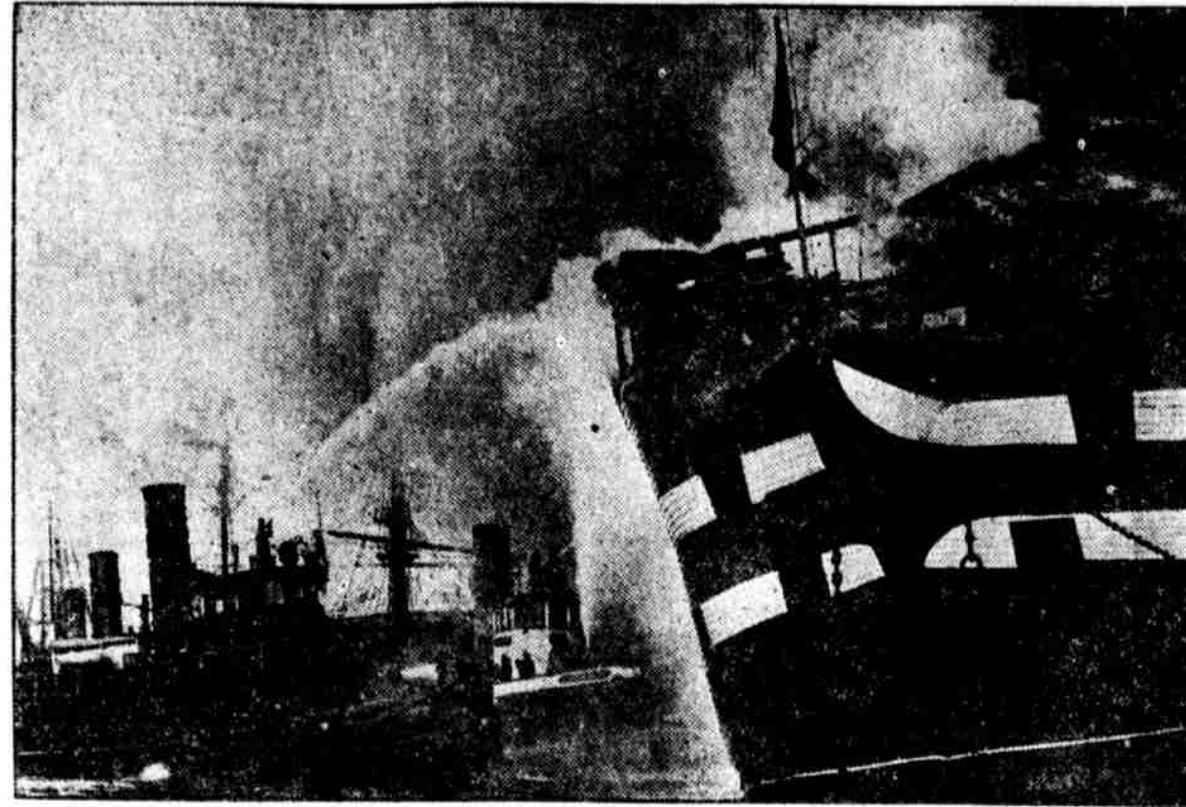




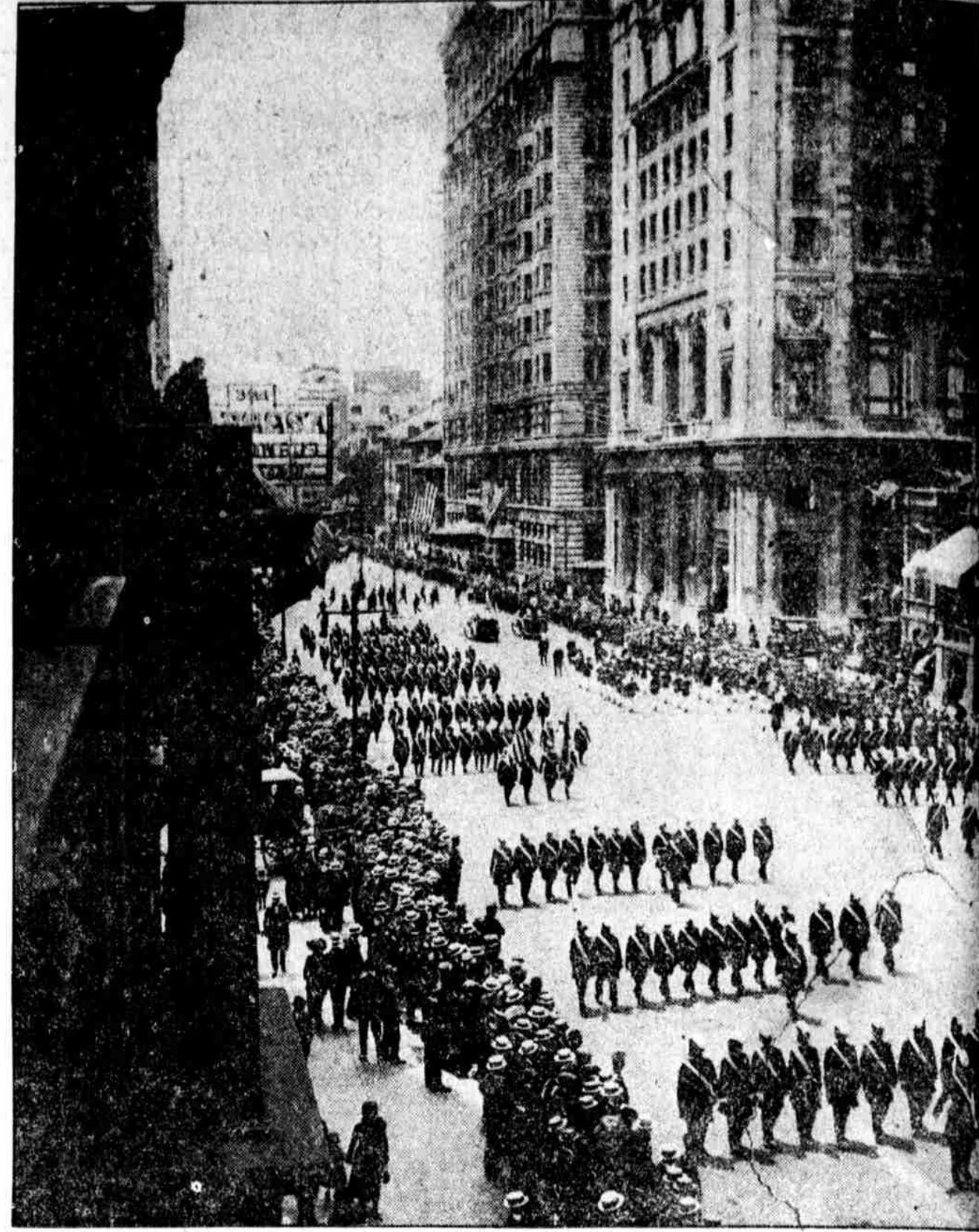
BOARDING THE MAYFLOWER. Senator and Mrs. Knox accompanied President Harding to New York for the services held in honor of United States soldiers who died in France.



THEIR OWN BAND. The commandery from Middletown, Pa., came down with a large delegation and their very attractively dressed music makers.



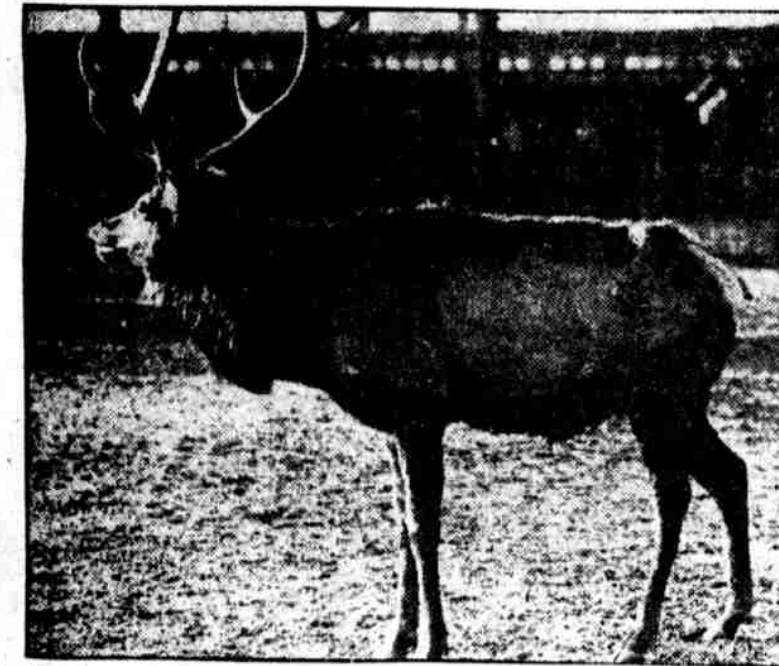

VIEWS MARINE CAMP FROM AIR. Secretary of the Navy Denby just before taking a flight in a naval plane at Quantico, Virginia.



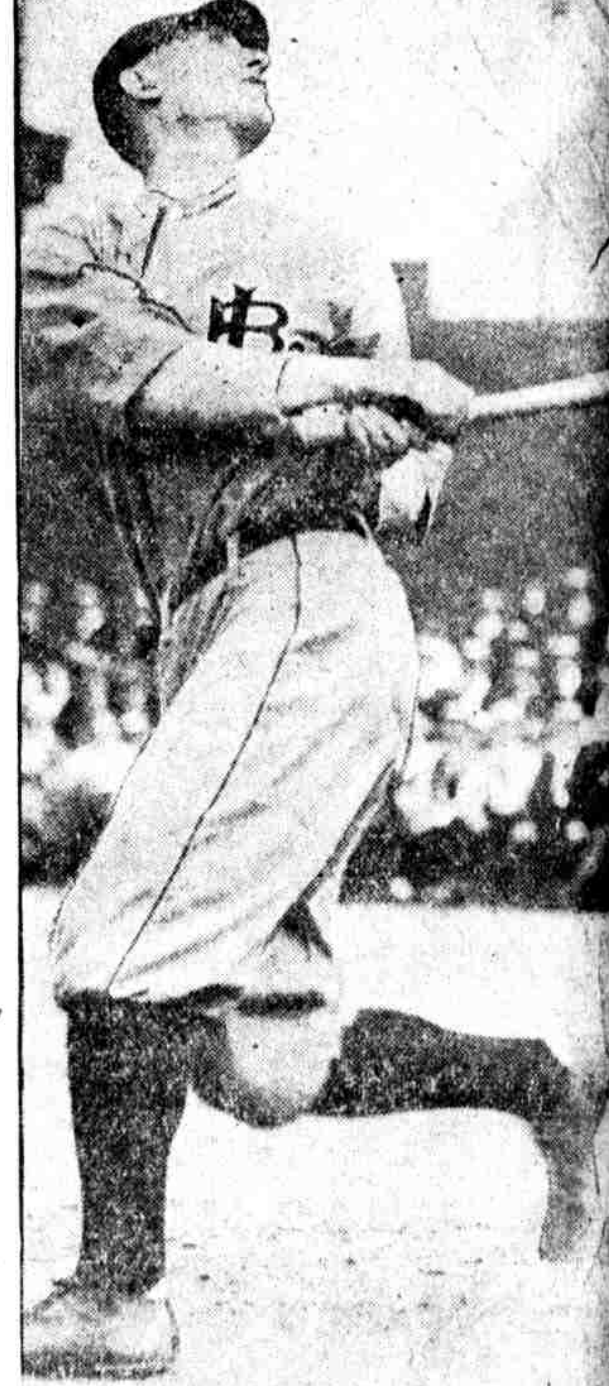
CONTENTED IN NEW HOME. This American elk is one of the late arrivals at the Philadelphia Zoological Gardens.

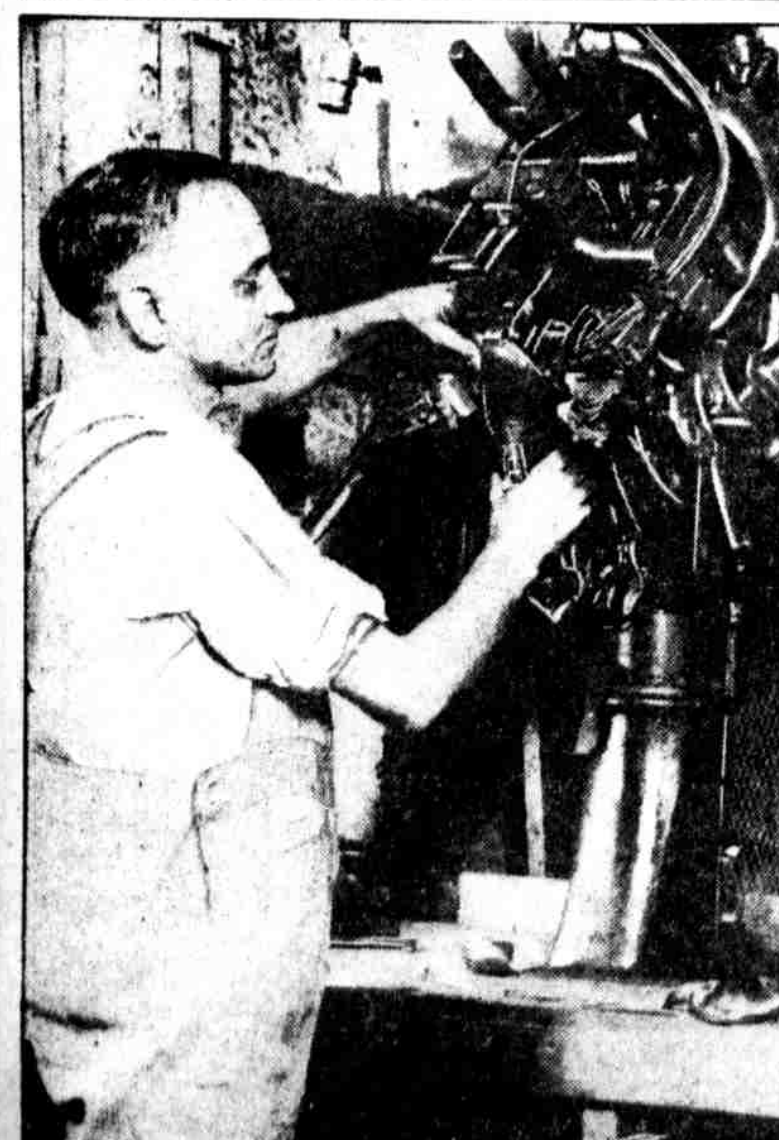


ONE OF THE BEST. Schafer, the first baseman of the Lit Brothers' ball team, is a dependable batter and a swift fielder.
