

LEGION POSTS PLAN FOR MEMORIAL DAY

Philadelphia Navy Yard Sailors and Marines Will Co-operate in Exercises

PARADE TO BE FEATURE

Through co-operation of the commandant at the Philadelphia Navy Yard, a large number of sailors and marines stationed there will co-operate with different Legion Post in decorating graves of veterans in Philadelphia Memorial Day.

In the Memorial Day parade, starting at Broad and Arch streets at 9 o'clock, the Navy Yard Band, composed of sailors with infantry equipment and a platoon equipped as artillery, will march with the Navy Veterans' Detachment. Two squads equipped as infantry and a trumpeter will go to Collingswood, N. J., to assist Collingswood Lodge, No. 210, in ceremonies at graves.

Firing squads and a trumpeter of sailors will be attached to the following posts for ceremonies in the cemeteries: George Gordon Meade Post, G. A. R.; Naval Post, No. 197, American Legion; Army and Navy Union; Naval Post, No. 400, of the Legion; Hamilton Fish Post, of the Legion, and a detachment to the Borough of National Park, N. J., to participate in the municipal memorial services to be held there, in which legionnaires will also take part.

The naval artillery detachment marching in the parade, will take part in the ceremonies at the Vine street pier in memory of sailors who were lost at sea. The platoon will go into battery at the end of the pier and will fire a salute from their field pieces over the water.

Veterans and townspeople of Fort Washington will hold elaborate exercises Memorial Day. A military pageant, including veterans and all school children of the vicinity will march to Fort Hill, where Judge John Faber Miller, of Montgomery County, will make an address. The William Boniton Dixon Post, No. 10, of the Legion, will take part in the exercises, which will be in charge of Commander Edward F. Quinn. Stern Price Post, No. 417, giving a smoker last Thursday evening at Yonah Hall, 2727 Columbia avenue. Many novel entertainment features were introduced and members had as their guests a number of veterans from the northwest section of the city. The affair was in charge of Dr. Charles S. Schaefer, commander of the post.
