

BACKMAIL SCHOOL FOR FAIR SIRENS
Police Seek King of Extortionists Who Had His Lures Specially Trained
TRAIL IN REID CASE

New York, May 27.—Every review of the police department has called into play, says the New York American, to bring finally to justice a master extortionist, who is credited with having netted \$10,000,000 from susceptible millionaires in the last twenty years. The story continues as follows:
Although they know his real name, the police call this Napoleon for his careful in his selection of victims. He has worked in serene immunity from prosecution.
