Liberty Loan Issue Paid N. Y.

lars' worth of 6 per cent building loans In which several of the largest savings GIRL MUST RETURN HIS RING banks in New York City compelled the borrower to accept depreciated Liberty Bonds at par in lieu of cash were in-vestigated yesterday before the Lockwood Legislative Committee.

Other loans granted on condition that borrowers would purchase real estate the lending institutions acquired on foreclosures also were brought out in

making loans conditional upon their getting rid of Liberty Bonds at par or unloading real estate undesired by them.

The practice of the Brooklyn Sav-

ings Bank, it was brought out, was to give the borrower a check for the loan and then he would immediately indorse and return the check to the bank which would honor it with Liberty Bonds of an equal face value, but worth less than 95 in the stock market, Larus E. Sut-ton, the comptroller of the bank, told the committee he thought there was a radical, fundamental difference between that sort of a deal and the pro paying the borrower in Liberty Bonds right at the start.

Paid in Liberty Bonds at Par He was asked to explain the difference, but he replied it would be very difficult to explain and that Samuel Untermyer, committee counsel, would not admit it. Mr. Untermyer asked the

witness to grant the fact that either borrower or lender could have gone in the market and obtained the bonds at "That is quite correct," said the banker, "but we did not do business that way. We loaned the bonds at 100, precisely what we had paid for them. "Why didn't you sell the bonds at 94

and give the borrower the cash?" Mr. Untermyer asked. 'Because we are trustees of the people's funds and we bought them at 100 and sold them at 100," Mr. Sutton

replied. When Mr. Untermyer asked the banker whether the bank was unusually anxious to get rid of some Liberty Bonds, he said no, explaining it was induced to do so by brokers who negotiated the deals.

It was by degrees he conceded that it was a condition of the loans that the borrower should buy Liberty Bonds from the bank at par. At first he said the bank gave the loan in the form of a check and then the borrower purchased the bonds from the bank with the check. Later he admitted the bank frequently sent both the check and the bonds torether to its attorneys, who completed e deal. Then he said it was part of the negotiation for the borrower to take the bonds. Finally he conceded it was a condition of the loan that he do so.

The Prudential Insurance Co. was under attack part of the day. Its president, Forrest F. "If clinics meet advantageously a public need, we might as well recog-nize the fact they have come to stay and that there number will increase.




