

HOUSE POLICE OF FORGIBLE ENTRY

Woman Swears Out Warrant Against Lieutenant Hamilton and Patrolman

CLUBHOUSE IS ENTERED

Mrs. A. Donnelly, 2405 Ann street, Port Richmond, last night swore out warrants before Magistrate Beaton, charging Lieutenant Andrew Hamilton and Patrolman James Lee, of the Belgrade and Clearfield streets station, with forcible entry and malicious mischief.

The police lieutenant and patrolman have been notified to appear at a hearing before Magistrate Beaton, at 1 o'clock, Monday afternoon. They are alleged to have committed the malicious mischief and forcible entry in the Frank F. Faulkner Club, at 2405 Ann street, last Saturday.

Lieutenant Hamilton, who acknowledged service of the warrant, said today he did not know Mrs. Donnelly, unless she is the woman who appeared to him in charge of the clubhouse.

The lieutenant said he received a telephone call last Saturday, stating a gang of thirty men had gathered at Cedar and Ann streets, and were acting in a disorderly manner. Among other acts, it was alleged, the men were throwing stones at delivery wagons of the Cramp's shipyard.

According to the lieutenant, he called a detail, and in plain clothes went to the scene in a patrol wagon. When the patrol arrived, he said, the gang dispersed, and some of the men took refuge in the clubhouse.

The lieutenant and Patrolman Duffy entered the house in their pursuit of the men, he said. The men then jumped from windows of the club. A woman, identified as Mrs. Donnelly, told the lieutenant the men were not members of the club.

"I can't help that," he said he told her, and in plain clothes went to the scene, and it was his duty to attempt to capture them.

The lieutenant believes the action against him and the patrolman, instituted by general officer Gelling against the police in Port Richmond and Kensington.
