A Move to Reduce the High Cost of Living

The war is over. This is the reconstruction period—a period of readjustment of business conditions and a general reduction of living costs.

As certainly as the sun rises and sets every twenty-four hours, the cost of living has got to come down.

Manufacturers, wholesalers, retailers and workmen must all bear a share in the general reduction. Labor in many industries has already accepted wage reductions and prices in nearly every article of necessity have come down.

The Wilton and Brussels carpet and rug manufacturers are doing their share and have asked labor to co-operate. But the Wilton Weavers' Union has refused to do its share in accepting a just reduction of the heavy increases in wages granted in war times.

If Wilton weavers continue to draw war-time wages, the consuming public and workers in other industries who have accepted reductions will be paying the price.

Although the Wilton weavers are now receiving two-and-a-half times the wages they did before the war, they have refused the manufacturers' compromise of a 20% reduction and have been on strike for over five months.

Therefore, on June 15th, the Wilton Mills of the country purpose to resume operation on an open-shop basis.

Employment will be open to suitable men, either union or non-union.
