It is likely to be developed piecemeal as a community of interests and commercial relations are worked out by the working together of the English and the American Governments regarding German reparations and regarding the Silesian dispute.

Britain Over-Extended Empire

On the other hand, Great Britain is an over-extended Empire. We hold hostilities of hers in Canada in Australia, in the islands of the Pacific. She desires immensely the friendship and co-operation of this country. We desire certain commercial opportunities which can only be gained through an understanding. Everything points toward that understanding. It has been the outstanding policy of one country. It is the practical and immediate need of the other.
