George Hoffner, who won it in 1919, 1920, was 317 and J. J. Beadle was 318. There are those at Whitmarsh today who have been following Beck's returns, not so good, though it will be broken in that claim this might expect to be the new title-holder.

Wilmington, Del., June 23.—The feature of today's play in the Delaware State tennis tournament in progress at the Wilmington Country Club courts was the victory of Miss Molly Thayer, of the Philadelphia Cricket Club, over Miss Cottman, of Baltimore, in the final game, 6-1, 6-1.

Today the semi-finals will be played with Pearson playing Near and Johnson clashing with Bates.
