AUSTIN PLEADS GUILTY

Man Accused in Sharon Hill Murder Admits Complicity in Crime Media, Pa., June 28.—John Austin, a Negro, who was charged through eight States by Detective E. G. Crawford, of New York, and finally arrested for murder in the mountains near Moraviantown, W. Va., pleaded guilty yesterday to second-degree murder for his part in the slaying of John Dalton, son of Dr. David Dalton, of Sharon Hill, last July.

The plea of second-degree murder came as a surprise, because Austin had testified during the trial of his confederate that he had nothing to do with the murder, but stood behind a tree and witnessed Roanoke Jasper and Walter Lewis shoot Dalton. Lewis was convicted of murder in the first degree.

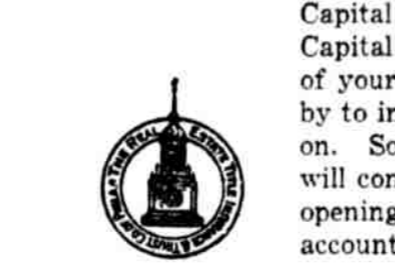
