"C. L. T."—It will probably be necessary for you to bring suit against the party who is running the suit club to compel him to live up to the terms of his written advertisement and contract.

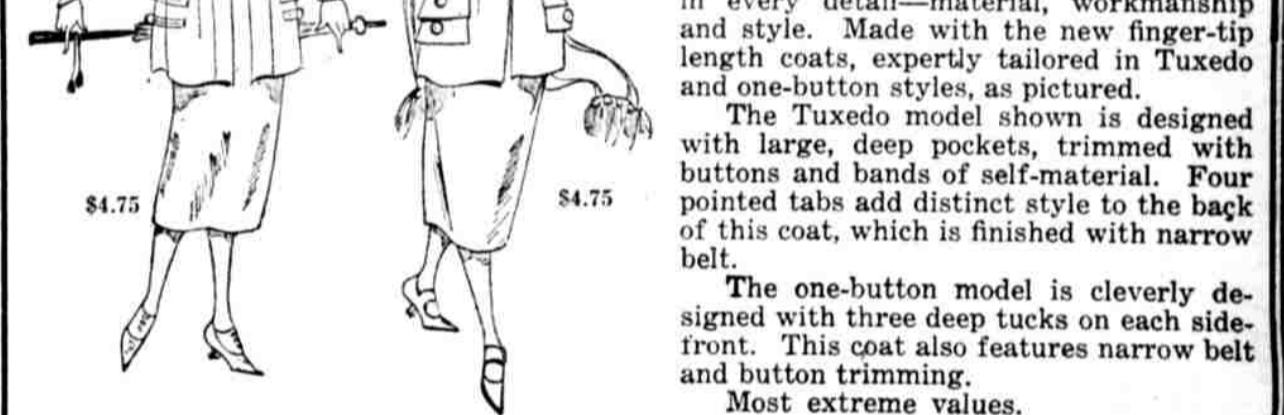
