CREDIT MOBILIZATION VITAL

Special Cable Dispatch. Copyright, 1921 London, June 30. — The resolution emphasizing the necessity of establishment of export credits under Government auspices for the reconstruction of Europe, which was considered yesterday by the finance group of the International Chambers of Commerce, brought out long discussion by George E. Roberts, vice president of the National City Bank of New York.

Mr. Roberts pointed out the United States as suffering with a disorganization of industry and exchanges as a result of the war. The world, he said. needs the opening of the old channels of distribution and the old sources of supply, which means that each country in studying to help itself must study the world situation.

The purchasing power of every country rests in its own powers of pro-duction." he said. "We must set up the whole world machine in order to get our own part to run. There must be a general mobilization of capital and credit to take products from the producers for cash and to sell them where wanted on credit. The ordinary supply be forthcoming.


