

MORE SCHOOL NURSES URGED

Present Number Inadequate to Cope With Conditions, Research Bureau Says

FURBUSH'S PLEA CITED

The need of additional public school nurses was emphasized today by the Bureau of Municipal Research, which called attention to a memorandum sent by Health Director Furbush to the Board of Education.

The bureau, in a statement today, thus summarized the Director's recommendations:

"With the present inadequate number of school nurses there are 65,000 elementary school children entirely without nurse service. Moreover, there is no attempt to furnish this service to the elementary continuation schools, the Girls' Trade School, the junior high schools or the senior high schools.

"There are at present many nurses who have 4000 pupils in their assignments, while experience shows that the maximum number should be 3000 pupils per nurse.

"Despite limitations of personnel, the division of medical inspection of public schools is now securing correction of about 50 per cent of the physical defects found by the medical inspectors. "It is proposed to broaden the work of the division of medical inspection of public schools by entering upon greater activity in correcting malnutrition and in the promotion of hygienic habits, including dental hygiene.

"It is recommended to inaugurate the plan of having one nurse for every 3000 of the school population. This would increase the corps of nurses from forty to one hundred and eighty-two, plus an additional nurse to be attached to the Bureau of Compulsory Education, and one supervising nurse."

While the Health Director proposes, the Research Bureau added, it is the Board of Education that disposes by voting the necessary money.

"The board has always shown so sympathetic an attitude toward efforts to improve the health of school children that it will undoubtedly do all it can to meet the suggestions of the health authorities," the bureau concluded.

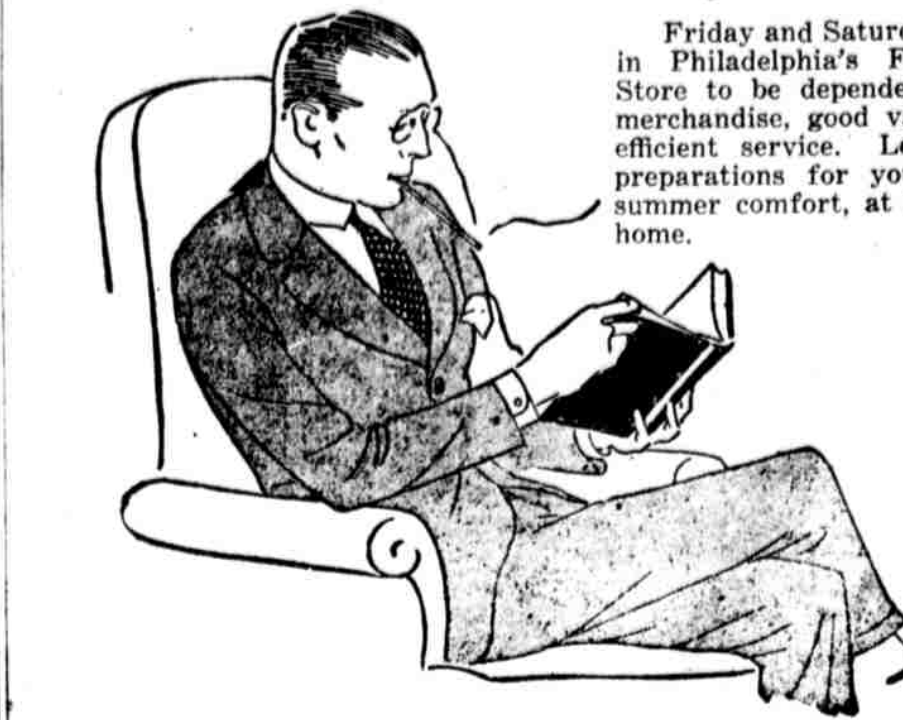
