MIDDLE WEST SIZZLES

No Relief From Abnormally High Temperature in Sight Chicago, July 7.—(By A. P.)—Chicago and much of the Middle West today were still in the grip of a record-breaking heat wave, with the local Weather Bureau announcing no relief in sight. The thermometer here, which registered 82 early this morning, was steadily rising, after a sweltering night when thousands sought the beaches and parks, which had been opened for sleeping purposes. The heat yesterday had held directly responsible for five deaths and dozens of prostrations in Chicago.

PROBE MUTINY ON U. S. SHIP

Poconchos Crippled by Crew Causing Damage to Machinery Naples, July 7.—(By A. P.)—The American Consulate here is engaged in an investigation of the mutiny on board the American steamship Poconchos which left New York May 23 and did not arrive here until Monday last because of trouble with the crew and damage to the machinery which necessitated stops at the Azores and St. Michaels for repairs. Because of the seamen's strike in New York a crew consisting mostly of foreigners, was engaged for the Poconchos.

\$500,000,000 TO BE PAID TO RAILROADS

Refunding Arrangement Made by Carriers' Executives and Secretary Mellon

U. S. TO GET 6 P. C. SECURITY

By the Associated Press Washington, July 7.—Treasury Secretary Mellon announced today that, under a refunding arrangement made with the railroad executives, the carriers would receive approximately \$500,000,000 in additional advances from the Federal Government within the next six months. Mr. Mellon said the negotiations with the railroad executives probably would be completed within two days, and that the advances contemplated would give to the railroads in cash, sums of money equivalent to those which the Government spent in capital betterments during the period of wartime control. The Government will receive for the advances 6 per cent security, evidencing the indebtedness of the particular railroads which receive the advances. Mr. Mellon indicated that additional appropriations would be sought from Congress to make the advances, although the Treasury will be able to supply a portion of the requirements out of funds now available or by virtue of the authority to borrow already given in various laws governing the relation of the Government to railroad operations.

POISONED BY WHISKY

One Man Dead, Another Dying, From Drink Given by Stranger Pottsville, Pa., July 7.—(By A. P.)—One man is dead and another dying from what is believed to be poisoning, administered by a man whose identity is known only as "Joe," who robbed his unconscious victims and then escaped. The dead man, Frank Spino, wife and seven children, and Charles Costanza, the other victim, were accosted by "Joe," who promised to show them how they could double their money. Spino had \$100 and Costanza \$25 as they accompanied Joe on to the mountain just outside this city. The two victims were given a drink of whisky out of a bottle and soon became violently ill. "Joe" left them ostensibly to go for a doctor, and soon both lapsed into unconsciousness. Spino died in the stupor, but his companion revived sufficiently after eight hours to stumble his way into Palo Alto, where he reported the robbery and murder.

ATTEMPT TO BLOW UP MINE

Coal and Coke Plant Damaged by Giant Powder Explosion Masontown, Pa., July 7.—(By A. P.)—What is believed by the authorities to have been an attempt to blow up Donald Mine No. 3, of the Connellsville Consolidated Coal and Coke Co., near here last night destroyed the lamp house and badly damaged the boiler plant. Windows in other mine buildings and miners' houses were shattered. There were three explosions. Officers of the company said that no explosive had been sent by them to the

property, as the mine has been closed for five months. Search of the wreckage today, however, revealed the presence of a considerable quantity of giant powder. The State police are investigating.
