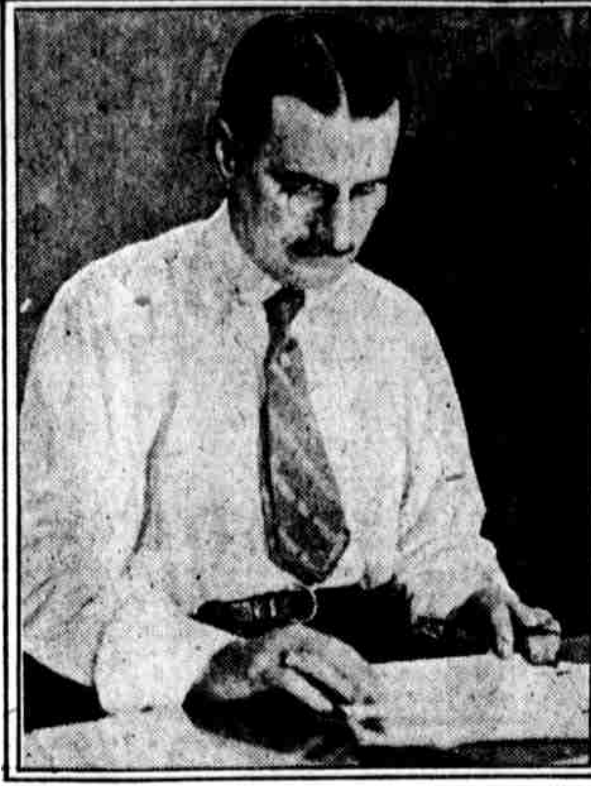

BACK AT HIS DESK. Director Cortelyou, of Public Safety, picked a hot day to return to his duties at City Hall. He had been ill ten days.



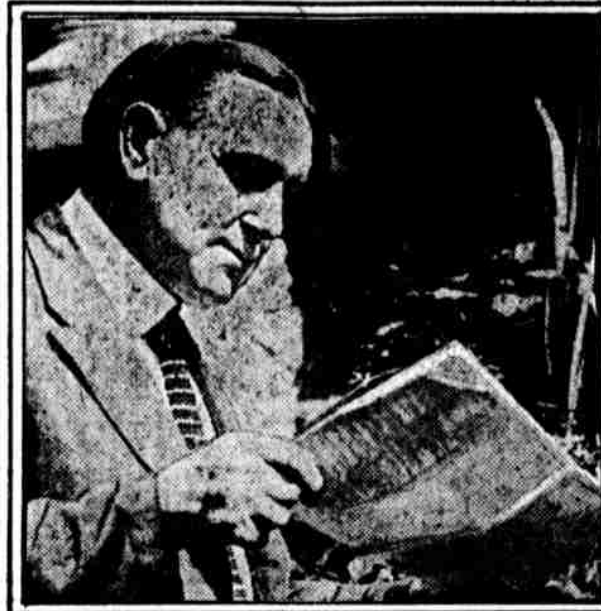
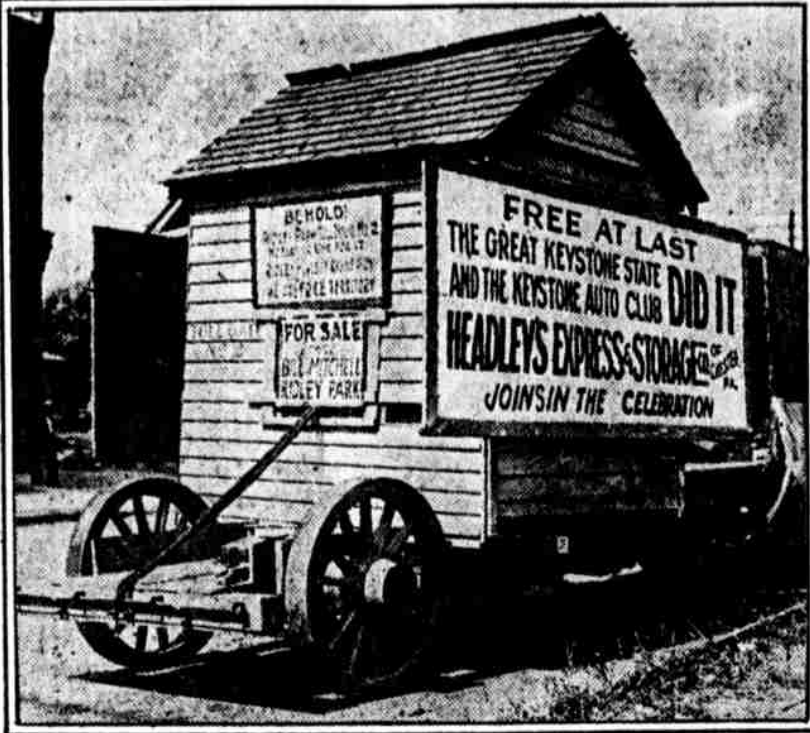

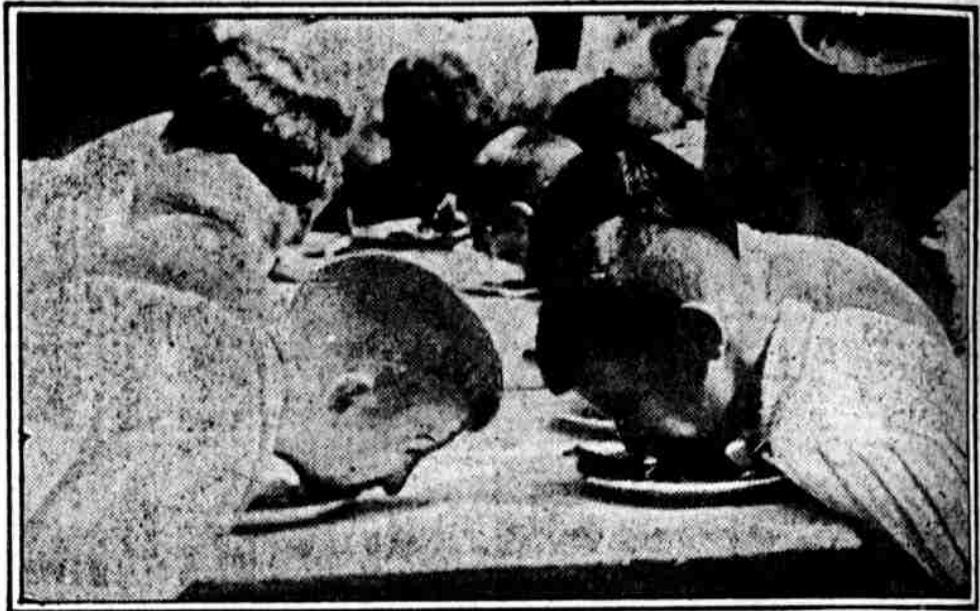

THE REV. WILLIAM BARNES LOWER, of Olney, will spend six weeks on missionary tour through Montana, Wyoming and Colorado.



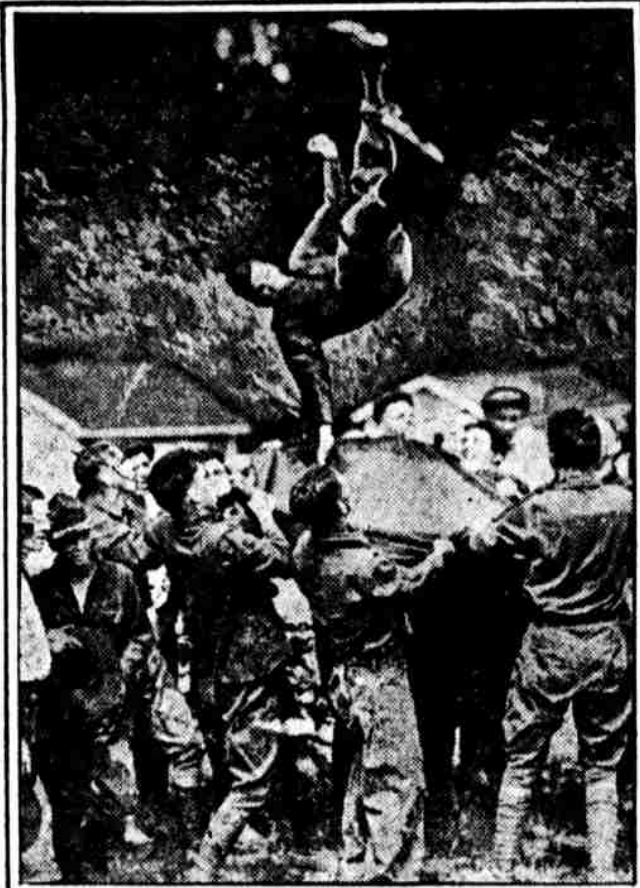

UP HE GOES. It was his first time in camp. His company mates decided to allow him to enjoy the air at Mount Gretna.

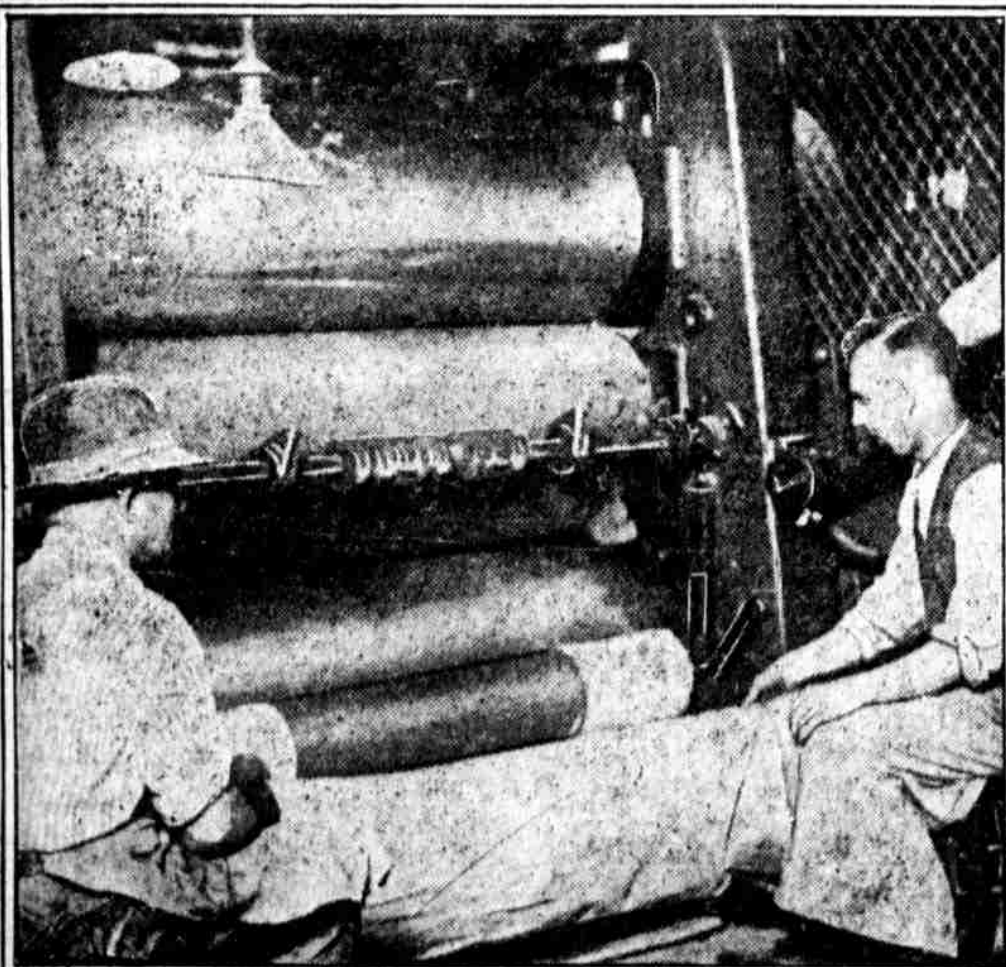

MAYOR MOORE in his office, where he received officials of Pennsylvania S. P. C. A. It was National Horse Day. Marion Yunker tagged the Mayor.

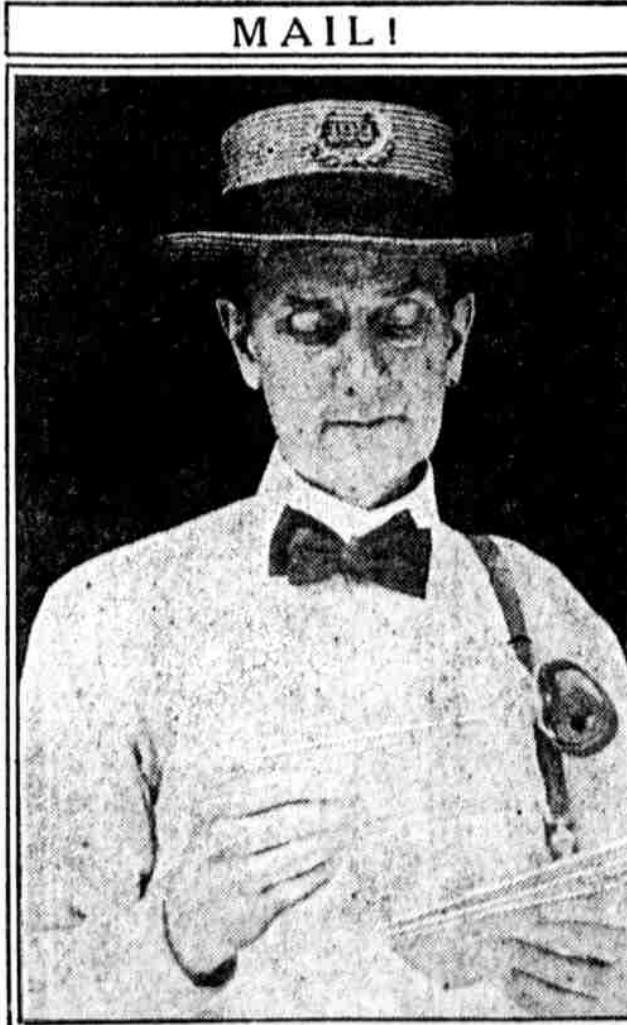
