the law retroactive. Second. Repeal of the higher sur tax brackets, those above 32 per cent, as of January 1, 1921, and the remaining, above 25 per cent, as of 1, 1922. Third Reduction of the transpor-

tation tax by one-half, as of Jan-uary 1, 1922, and entirely, as of Fourth. Repeal of the so-called soda water tax, the so-called luxury tax of clothing, and of other "nuis-

ance" taxes.

With few exceptions there will be no new taxes levied, under the agreement errived at, outside of an increase of the flat tax on corporations to 12½ per cent and possibly other minor taxes under consideration.
