BUSINESS ON CURB EXTREMELY DULL

Transactions Represent Closing Out of Contracts by Speculative Element

New York, Aug. 13.—The New York Curb market was of the usual summer half-holiday character. Very little business was transacted in the short trading period with which the week ended, and most of the few transactions represented closing out of contracts by some of the element that has taken a speculative interest in the market in the early part of the week.

A feature was the decline in Car Light and Heat, which sold down to 35c a share. Glen Alden Coal on moderate terms, which sold at 34 1/2 and 35c, and a sale of Intercontinental Rubber was made at 7 1/2. Southern Coal and Iron sold at 2 1/2. United Retail Candy Company, which sold at 10 1/2, Tidal Oil was traded in at 11, showing a moderate advance. There was a fair amount of business in Salt Creek at 1 1/2.
