

NAB MAN BURNED BY EXPLODING STILL

Firemen Rescue Samuel Mockel From Burning Bathroom—Arrested Later at Hospital

APPARATUS AS EVIDENCE

Firemen dragged Samuel Mockel, fifty-five years old, from the bathroom of a house at 2032 Blavis street at 8:27 o'clock this morning after he had been overcome and seriously burned by the explosion of a whisky still and the resultant blaze.

Flames were rapidly filling the bathroom and an adjoining room and had burned the head, face and arms of the unconscious Mockel, when firemen Jordan and Costello, of Engine Company No. 50, rescued him. He was taken to St. Luke's Hospital.

Later, Steve Peadyaky, owner of the house, told the police Mockel was a bartender and had been operating a whisky still in the bathroom on the second floor when it exploded.

Acting Sergeant Bickel, of the Twenty-second street and Hunting Park

station, went immediately to St. Luke's Hospital and placed Mockel under guard pending his recovery.

Firemen confined the flames to the bathroom and an adjoining bedroom on the second floor.

According to the police, the flames destroyed the liquor Mockel was distilling, although the still was saved from the flames and taken to the Twenty-second street and Hunting Park station to be used as evidence against Mockel.

Man Severely Scalded

Peter Donahue, fifty-seven years old, 525 South Second street, was severely scalded yesterday when the boiler of the launch *Bertha II*, exploded at Pier 5, South Wharves. Donahue is the fireman of the launch. He is in the Pennsylvania Hospital.

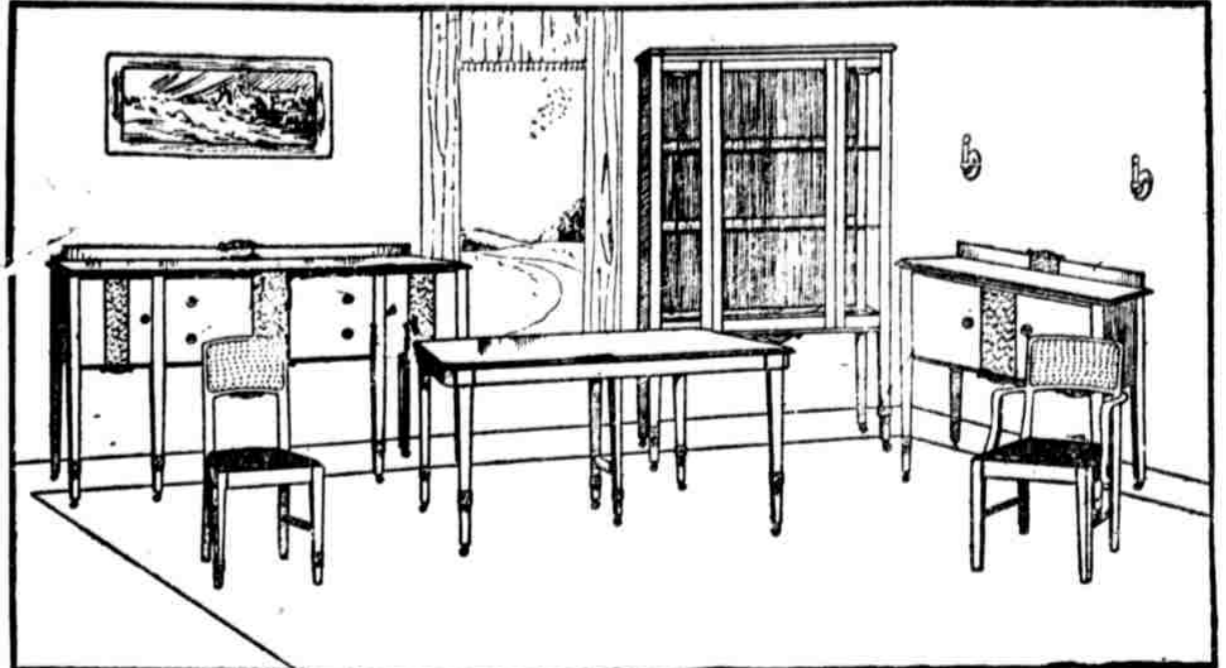
