

POSSE CAPTURES ALLEGED ROBBER

Philip Graffi, of South Eighth Street, Phila., Accused of Hammonton Crime

HIS COMPANION ESCAPES

After an exciting chase through the woods near Hammonton, N. J., last night, Philip Graffi, thirty-five years old, 912 South Ninth street, Philadelphia, was captured by the Hammonton police and a posse about three miles out of town and held without bail charged with attempted robbery and attempted assault with intent to kill. Graffi, with another man not yet captured, is alleged to have entered the service station of Mr. and Mrs. John Oakes, opposite Lillian-on-the-Lake Hotel in Hammonton, late yesterday afternoon. Both men suddenly drew pistols, presented them in the faces of the Oakes couple and demanded money.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Oakes drew revolvers. One of the bandits grabbed Mrs. Oakes, twisted her arms behind her back, got her pistol and then held the woman in such a position that her husband could not fire at either intruder. Without obtaining anything, the men ran from the station when the alarm had been taken to the nearby hotel by the Oakes' twelve-year-old daughter. Employees of the hotel rushed across the street, but the men had fled. Afraid to approach the bandits unarmed, the employees kept the men in sight until the police, led by Chief Mattulo, arrived. They joined in the chase, and after several hours arrested Graffi hiding in the woods.

They also arrested Charles Deseo, of 1235 South Eleventh street, driver of the car in which the bandits arrived. Deseo was released in \$500 bail when he convinced the police he had nothing to do with the robbery attempt. Deseo, who was held as a material witness, is a driver for Samuel Cartello, 327 Christian street, who owns the car. The prisoners refused to reveal the identity of the third man.

Motorcyclist Hurt in Crash
A motorcycle was struck by an automobile last night at Broad and Thompson streets, severely injuring the rider of the motorcycle, Edward Russell,

thirty-six years old, of 2108 North Mervine street. He is in St. Joseph's Hospital. J. W. Clark, front street near Pearl, driver of the automobile, was arrested.
