

AUTOISTS IN TOILS AT MAGNOLIA, N. J.

200 Stopped, 14 Arrested and 5 Fined, on Busy Sunday

FIVE FROM THIS CITY

William Jackson, Philadelphia business man and Justice of the Peace of Magnolia, N. J., had the busiest Sunday afternoon and night of the summer. He collected \$115 in fines from violators of the automobile law along the White Horse pike, of which sum \$2.90 represented his fee.

Magnolia, located on the pike, is used to Sundays when automobiles run in long lines almost touching on their way home from the shore. Last night the motorists surprised themselves, however. Of the thousands of machines which passed through Magnolia, 200 were stopped by the town's special policemen and fourteen were arrested. Only five, however, were fined.
