

### CHIEF SUSPENDED AFTER RAID ON INN

Springfield Commissioners Want Bysher to Explain Failure to Stop Gambling

### STATÉ POLICE HAD TO ACT

A. G. Bysher was suspended indefinitely without pay last night as chief of police of Springfield Township, Montgomery County, for incompetency and dereliction of duty, pending a thorough investigation of his failure to detect gambling at the Wheel Pump Inn, raided last Friday night by the State police.

The township commissioners unanimously adopted the resolution suspending Bysher, and ordered him to turn over his badge to Harry Kuntze, named acting chief of police to serve during Bysher's suspension.

Bysher was ordered to cease all duties as a police officer of the township at midnight and is prohibited from using any of the township's motor vehicles and to act in any police capacity.

He will have ample opportunity to explain why the gambling resort was permitted to flourish a short distance from the township building wherein Bysher made his headquarters. For the present he will be permitted to continue occupancy of the building as a residence, but he must report all police calls to the acting chief, and all other township business to one of the commissioners.
