

2 KILLED, ONE HURT IN CROSSING CRASH

Farm Laborers Die When Engine Hits Truck Near Chadds Ford

Two men were killed and another seriously injured when a small motortruck on which they were riding was struck by a train at Twin Bridges, two miles below Chadds Ford, late yesterday afternoon.

Alexander Jefferson, 76 Douglas street, Wilmington, and Vincent Whitaker, 710 Lincoln street, Wilmington, were killed. Norman Gaines, 2510 West Locust street, Wilmington, is in the Chester County Hospital in a serious condition. All are Negroes.

The men, with a number of others employed on the farm of Joseph Luke, were being taken to Wilmington. There were few witnesses of the accident, other than occupants of the truck. Police say no one is able to explain satisfactorily the cause of the accident.

At the point where the northbound express crashed into the automobile, there is a clear view of the truck. According to authorities, it is believed the driver saw the train coming and attempted to cross the tracks in its path.

The men who were killed and injured were on the rear of the machine, the part which received the full force of the collision. The motortruck was spun around, overturned and the occupants spilled over the roadway.

Another truck, containing laborers from the same farm, was following. The men were taken to the hospital, where examination of the other occupants of the damaged machine showed no one else was seriously injured.
