

SIR SAM HUGHES DEAD IN CANADA

Dominion's Wartime Minister of Munitions Succumbs After Long Illness

HE HELPED WIN THE WAR

By the Associated Press. Lundy, Ont., Aug. 24.—Sir Sam Hughes, former Canadian Minister of Munitions and a leading figure in the political life of the Dominion, died at his home here early today.

Pernicious anemia, from which he had suffered since his return from Europe last winter, caused his death. Sir Sam had been reported several times at the point of death, but his indomitable will brought him through the crises and he appeared to be gaining strength until two weeks ago, when he suffered a final relapse.

and was created a Knight Commander of the Order of Bath by King George. His resignation from the office of Minister of Munitions at the request of Sir Robert Borden, Prime Minister, followed long-continued friction with his colleagues. An investigation, conducted at Sir Sam's request, into charges that he had made profits from army contracts, completely exonerated him.

General Sir Sam Hughes was born in Darlington, Ont., January 8, 1853, and received his education in the public schools of the Dominion. Afterward he lectured on English literature and history in Toronto College Institute until 1885, when he purchased the Lindsay Warder and became its editor.

As a Liberal-Conservative he was a member of the Canadian House of Commons from 1892 to the time of his death. He was always deeply interested in military affairs and in bringing about the closest possible affiliation between Canada and the British Empire, and many years before the World War visited the Zeppelin University, and during the Boer War he served in Africa as commander of a mounted brigade. Twenty-five Passengers Are Injured When Train Plunges into Creek at Grand Junction, Colo., Aug. 24.—(By A.
