

# MAN SHOT IN CHASE OF AUTO THIEVES

**Patrolman's Bullet Halts Fugitive as He Runs With Four Companions**

## OTHERS ARE CAUGHT

After a chase, during which several shots were fired, five men who attempted to steal an automobile belonging to E. L. Porter, 6200 Pine street, shortly after 3 o'clock this morning, were captured by the police.

Cyril Burns, Fifty-second and Callowhill streets, one of the prisoners, was shot in the right hand. Each was held in \$300 bail for a further hearing by Magistrate Price.

Patrolman Lewis, of the Fifth-fifth and Broad station, noticed the men acting suspiciously around the car. It stood in front of the Porter home. Four of the men jumped in the automobile while another went to remove the license number.

Lewis drew his revolver and told the men they were under arrest. They left the car and fled out Pine street, where they fired several shots. One of the bullets struck Burns, who quickly surrendered. The shooting attracted the attention of Detectives Burns and Bryan. They caught the other four men as they were turning up Sixty-first street.

The men captured by the detectives gave their names as John McLaughlin, Vine and Roffield streets; Fred Craig and Frank Craig, Thirty-sixth and Vine streets, and John Burns, Sixty-second street and Girard avenue.
