IMMIGRANT SHIPS RACE INTO PORT

Three Vessels in Close Finish at N. Y.—September Quota of Greeks Already Exceeded

7 CRAFT AT QUARANTINE

New York, Sept. 1.—Strainships raced to port today from beyond the three-mile limit in efforts to be the first to arrive in September with immigrants from countries whose monthly quotas under the restrictive immigration law were in danger of being exceeded.

Having anchored outside the harbor for a few days past, three of the ships made a close finish at the quarantine station. Unofficial watchers reported that the steamship King Alexander, from Piraeus, with 685 Greek immigrants, had defeated the Acropolis, from Patris, with 134 Greeks by two minutes.

The King Alexander stopped at quarantine for inspection this morning. The standard time, the vessel has more Greeks aboard than the September quota permits. The September quota of admissible Greeks is large enough to cover the contingents of both the Gdansk and the Lithuania.
