

Hearing Discloses Fourteen-Year Fight of W. P. Newman to

Avoid Mother's Tangled Career

With his grandmother, Mrs. Mary Newman, in Orange, N. J.

"Bince he has steadfastly refused to see her, communicate with her or even speak to her when she accosts him. In her determination to win him back she has stopped at no ends. She has written letters, lay in wait for him on the street, called on the phone, visited his places of employment, and even cabled to General Pershing seeking to force his release from the army when he was abroad.

"On October 26 last Winthrop and I were married in the chambers of Supreme Court Justice Charles I. Guy. we discouraged public announcement because Winthrop did not want his mother to have means of tracing him. But within a couple of months she icarned of the marriage and placed a tice in the newspapers.

"Then she found out that we were living here and she made life miserable for us. Finally, for our own protection, we obtained the court summons." Previously several affairs that had

brought Mrs. Warner into public no-tice were climaxed in March, 1908, when she was arrested charged with the theft of more than \$20,000 in jewels
