

For Blanket Ends

The edge of a blanket that comes to the top of the hed often gets solled, when the rest of it will be perfectly clean, and it doesn't do nice wool or wool and cotton blankets any good to be frequently laundered.

For that reason many women like to have the ends covered with a slip-on case that can easily be removed and laundered.

The length of the material chosen for O. The length of the material chosen for this case will go across the width. For instance, if your bianket measures seventy inches in width, you will need two yards of the white material for the cover. To make the cover nine inches deep, cut the cloth fully twenty-one inches wide. This strip, twenty-one inches wide and two yards long, is then folded together so it measures ten and a half inches in width. Seam it across the ends. Lay an inch wide hem entirely around the long sides. This hem can be hemstiched or hemmed on the machine, and the stitching covered with a row of fine featherstitching done in a heavy mercerized floss so it will show the center of the length on what is to be the upper side, embroider an initial or monogram, making it as elab-


